Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert the sum of ten pounds current money of the State

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Agness the sum of ten pounds current money of this State

Item I give and bequeath unto my sons, John and Jacob the whole of the lands now in my possession being one half of a tract purchased by me and my son George which is

devided by a line runing from Lockards Road to the River, provided nevertheless that when either of them shall judge it expedient to remove from said lands the other shall pay him the one half of the money to which it may be valueed by two indifferent persons by them chosen----- do hereby constitute make and ordain my wife Agnes, my son George & James Blankhead my only & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament, utterly revoking disannulling all & every other will & testament ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will and testament In Witness Whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal the day & year above written
