I Thomas Carroll of the District and State aforesaid being far advanced in years but in perfect health of body and of sound mind, anxious to dispose of my estate to such of my children and grand children as best suits my inclination, I therefore make the following disposition by this my last will and testament. Therefore,

I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Carroll my negro man Silas and the money received as the price of Boson, to him and his heirs for ever.

To my grand daughter Esther Carroll, the daughter of my Son Joseph Carroll, I also give and bequeath a young negro woman named Betty.

To her and her heirs forever. To my grand son Thomas Carroll, son of Joseph Carroll, I also give and bequeath the negro man Lewis whom he has now in his possession, to him and his heirs forever.

To my son John Carroll I give and bequeath my negro woman Judy and her two sons, Elias and Green, and also my negro woman Perlina, to him and his heirs forever.

To my son Matthew Carroll I give and bequeath my negro man Abel and my negro woman Prudy, to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever.

To my Grand son Thomas Carroll, son of Matthew Carroll, I give and bequeath my negro boy Adam, to him and his heirs for ever.

To my grandson Moses Carroll, son of Matthew Carroll I give and bequeath my negro child Sarah, daughter of Aimy, to him and his heirs forever. But it is my express will and direction that the said child Sarah shall not be seperated from its mother during her life time, and that the said negro Aimy do remain with and under the care of my Sons, Joseph Carroll and John Carroll

her life time, I also bequeath to him my grandson Moses Carroll fifty Dollars in money for the purposes of giving him a common English Education, which sum to be paid by my Executors as herein after directed.

To my Daughters Jinny Gallahr, I give my two negroes Jim and Andy to be delivered to her after the deaths of her husband John Gallahr. if she should survive him. But until the death of her husband the said negroes are to be kept as part of my estate, by my sons Joseph & John Carroll and the whole of the profits of their labor to be given to my daughter Jinny, at such times and under such conditions as my said sons Joseph and John may deem proper. And should she not survive her husband John Gallahr, after her death the said negroes Jim and Andy to go to my three sons Joseph John and Matthew, to them and their heirs forever.

I likewise give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Crafts and Samuel Crafts her husband the negro woman Esther and her children that are now living and such as she may have here after, during their natural lives, and after the death of the said Elizabeth & Samuel I give and bequeath said negro woman Esther and her children to the children of the said Elizabeth and Samuel Crafts to them and their heirs forever, to be equally divided among them.

The rest and residue of my personal property shall be sold by my executors, on a reasonable credit, and after paying the legacy of fifty dollars to my grand son Moses Carroll son of Matthew, the balance of the monies arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided among all my children. But that part which will fall to Jinny Gallahr, shall be Kept by my sons Joseph & John Carroll as trustees to that purpose, and be paid to her at their discretion.

I hereby nominate and appoint my two sons, Joseph Carroll and John Carroll Executors of this my last will and testament. And I do hereby cancel, annul, and revoke all and all manner of wills and testaments by me heretofore made, So that being this 18th day of August 1888
