Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Agness all the moveables now in my possession except such as may be sold to pay the following legecies, and the remainder of the orphant girl Sarah's time the goc.s above mentioned and the time of said girl to be disposed at her descretion-----

- Item I give and bequeath unto my son George the sum of ten pounds current money of the State
- Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elisabeth the sum of ten pounds current money of the State
- Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert the sum of ten pounds current money of the State
- Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Agness the sum of ten pounds current money of this State
- Item I give and bequeath unto my sons, John and Jacob the whole of the lands now in my possession being one half of a tract purchased by me and my son George which is
