ROBERT BLACK SEN.  
STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN The ninth day of October in the year <sup>cur</sup> of  
Lord 1779-- I Robert Black Sen. of the new acquisition Camden  
District South Carolina yeoman being in health and of perfect  
mind and memory thanks be given to God but calling to mind the  
mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all to  
die do make and ordain this my last will and testament, That is  
to say principally and first of all I give and recomend my soul  
into the hands of God who gave it and for my body I recomend it  
to the earth to be buried in Christian like and decent manner  
at the descretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the  
general Resurrection I shall receive the same by the Almighty  
power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it  
hath pleased God to bless me, I give devise and dispose of the  
same following manner and form--

Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Agness  
all the moveables now in my possession except such as may be  
sold to pay the following legacies, and the remainder of the  
orphant girl Sarah's time the goods above mentioned and the  
time of said girl to be disposed at her descretion-----

Item I give and bequeath unto my son George the sum of ten  
pounds current money of the State

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elisabeth the sum of  
ten pounds current money of the State

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert the sum of ten  
pounds current money of the State

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Agness the sum of  
ten pounds current money of this State

Item I give and bequeath unto my sons, John and Jacob the  
whole of the lands now in my possession being one half  
of a tract purchased by me and my son George which is

devided by a line runing from Lockards Road to the River, provided nevertheless that when either of them shall judge it expedient to remove from said lands the other shall pay him the one half of the money to which it may be valueed by two indifferent persons by them chosen-----I do hereby constitute make and ordain my wife Agnes, my son George & James Blankhead my only & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament, utterly revoking disannulling all & every other will & testament ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will and testament In Witness Whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal the day & year above written
