

I William Camp of the State of South Carolina, York District, being of sound and disposing mind and memory but now of a good old age and mindful of the certainty of death do for the purpose of settling all my worldly affairs after my death make declare and establish the following as my last will and testament in manner and form as follows viz:

1. It is my will and desire that as soon after my death as may be convenient my executors herein after appointed shall pay off all my just debts and collect all sums that may be justly due me.

2. I will & bequeath unto my beloved wife, Mary Camp, all my estate both real & personal of every description during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided share & share alike among my six children, Harriet B. Hardin, Lawrence S. Camp, Joseph P. Camp, Mary Caroline Starnes, Amanda F. Palmer, and Adalissa Camp, but if any of my children before named should die before my wife's death then the share to which they might have been entitled if living shall go to a child or children the deceased child may have living and it is my will and express bequeth that my negros at the death of my wife shall not be sold for partition but shall be as nearly equally as may be divided among my six children above named the child or children receiving the more valuable negroes to make up to the child or children who may receive the less valuable negroes and my land & other property of every description sold by my Executors at the death of my wife and equally divide the proceeds as before directed among my children.

3. It is my will & I hereby authorize and empower my wife & Executors if they should think it necessary & proper for the interest of my estate at any time during the life of my wife to partition off a portion of my estate equally among my children or to sell off any portion of my estate that may be absolutely necessary to pay debts or expenses during my wifes life but no partition or sale of any portion of my estate shall be made during my wifes life but by the Joint written consent of my wife and my executors.

4. I will and bequeath and hereby authorize and empower my Executors hereafter named to settle by a written instrument, the share of my estate that may be coming to my daughter Adalissa Camp upon her the said Adalissa Camp during her natural life & at her death to any child or children she may leave living.

5. I do hereby constitute and appoint Lawrence S. Camp, Noah Hardin, and John Starnes, Junior the Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness where of I have set my hand and seal this the 28th of May 1858.

The above will proved by testimony of John Moore in York District, South Carolina at October 12, 1859 Court. L. S. Camp, Noah Hardin & John Starnes qualified as ex-ecutors on February 6, 1860.

The executors and wife of William Camp, deceased, agreed on August 28, 1860, to sell all property and divide the proceeds. Jacob S. Wylie, E. A. Turner, William Moore, and J. B. Mintz witnessed this agreement.

The warrant of appraisement of William Camp's estate was addressed to John Moore, Jr., Wm. Moore, Sr., David Gaston, John B. Mintz, and David Cline and was dated February 9, 1860.

Executors sale bill filed December 10, 1866 and indicates Mary Camp died on December 5, 1866. J. P. Camp, D. G. Palmer, Noah Hardin, and Thomas Palmer bought her personal effects.

Final accounting of William Camp's estate mentions Ira Hardin, Wm. Moore, S. E. Moore, J. S. Wylie, O. E. Moore, G. G. Wylie, Jacob Camp, Samuel Wylie, A. Hardin, J. B. Mintz, John Bridges. Mentions heirs Noah Hardin and wife, L. S. Camp, J. P. Camp, A. F. and D. G. Palmer, Adalissa Mintz and Mary Starnes.

Sale was held on November 7, 1860. Buyers included: John J. McCash, John Starnes, J. D. Young, E. Turner, Green Palmer, Noah Hardin, L. S. Camp, Drayton Mintz, Wm. Moore, J. B. Mintz, F. S. Ramsaur, Joseph Weber, Saml. Wylie, John G. Webber, John Young, John Wilkins, H. M. Moore, George Wilson, John Bridges, M. Starnes, and J. P. Camp. Total was \$1,514.94.

The appraisers of William Camp's estate were John Moore, Jr., Wm. Moore, Sr., David Gaston, Jno. B. Mintz, and David Cline. Estate appraised on February 1860.
