

## STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

In the Name of God Amen I William Chambers of York District being sick of body but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the Mortality of the body do make this my last will and testament in the following manner and form first it is my Will and desire that all my just debts be paid by my executors herein after named.

Item I give and devise to my beloved Mother Elizabeth Chambers the land whereon I now live to her and her heirs forever, and I also give and bequeth to my sad Mother all my estate and effects bonds notes books of Account, my stock of Horses Cattle sheep and hogs and my Negroes Tom, Sall, Isabella Davy, Isam Peggy & her Children Rachel & Cornelius--and Lavinia for her use and to dispose of the said Negroes as she shall think proper at her death and not to dispose of them or any of them during hir life but to keep them together on the plantation, but it is my Will and desire that at her death or before if she can to set Peggy and her two Children Rachel and Cornelius and Lavinia free, and to bind the said Rachel and Cornelius to some industrious person or persons until they and each of them shall seperately arrive to the age of twenty one Years, I also Nominate constitute and appoint James A. Whyte sole executor of this my last Will and testament and do hereby revoke disavow and disannul all former Wills by me made and allow this and no other to be my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and Seal the Ninth day of August 1818

Signed Sealed published and declared by the said William Chambers to be his last will & testament in presence of us who have Witnessed the same at his request & in his presence.
