In the name of God, amen. I, William Hagan being of sound mind and memory, but weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath please God to bless me with, do make & appoint this my last will, in manner following--that is to say:

I desire that my lawful debt be all paid out of the monies coming to me from W Henry Massy--now saved for the same. And should the said money prove insufficient for the purpose, then I desire that my Executors hereinafter named sell stock cows and horses and out of the moneys arising there from pay and satisfy such of my just debts as shall remain unpaid out of the monies above mentioned.

After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give to my wife, Mary Hagins A Negro woman, named Rose, a negro Girl named Dark and a negro boy named London also & allow her a bed and the House & Kitchen furniature; after her decease I give to my son in Law David Patten the negro girl rose & her increase to be his & his heirs forever and to my son Wm F Hagin I give after the decease of my wife the negro girl dark with her increase and the negro boy London to be his & his heirs forever. I give to my son James Hagins, the negro woman Jean and her two children, Charlett & gree to be his & his heirs forever--Further I give to my son James a claim I have against him of One Hundred dollars which I am bound to Wm Moffet for--I also give him One hundred dollars out of the price of negro boy, Isack, to be here after willed. Also a claim I have against him my son

James of Fifty Dollar for Corn. I give less to him--I give to my son in law David Patten two negroes a girl named Anica with

her increase and a molatto boy named Isack to be his & his heirs

forever, provide he pays to James Hatens my son the sum of one hundred Dollars and which is my will he should pay--

I give to my Wm P Hagins a negro boy named Jakob-- the Horse Saddle & bridle which he claims--the same to be his & his heirs forever my Land whereon I now live I give to my son Wm P Hagins to be his & his heirs forever.

I give to my wife Mary Hagins a sorrel mare saddle & bridle and at the death of my Wife the same to belong to my Daughter, the wif of David Patten. Lastly I do constitute & appoint my son-in-law David Patten executor of this my last will & testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 28 day of March 1832
