June 29th 1826 I being weak of Body but of sound mind, and
 Noing that it is appointed for all men to Die, I do make this
 my last will and testament, in the first place I allow my just
 Debts to be paid In the second place I leve and Bequeth to my
 beloved Wife a Negro girl Named mime and fore hundred Dollars
 to be paid out of my Estate, if there Should be so much Sold
 after paying my Debts, if not the Legatees is to make it up
 Equally to her in twelve months after my decese, But at her
 death mime and her Ingrese is to be Equally Divided between
 my three Children and their Body heirs, N. B. My wife is to
 have her Bed and furniture and her Clothes The Ballance of my
 property to be Equally Divided between my three Children by
 valuation that is my land and and Negroes all, but mime, that
 is Polly John and Wm A Hall John is to have the hundred Achers
 of Land that he lives on Wm. A. Hall the hundred achers that
 he lives on and Polly Garrison is to have her Share out of the
 negroes so as to make an equal devid between they three and if it
 cant be Divided Equally, them that draws the greatest share must
 pay up to the others in twelve months of sell somany of the ne-
 groes as will raise money to make an equal devide the Ballance of
 my property is all to be sold but what is wild I allow Majer T.
 Hall to be my Lawful Executor.
