of the state & district above named Being weak & in a Low state of health at present But of a Sound & disposing mind & memory do at this time make & constitute this my Last Will & testament in manner & form following that is to say---First to my Wife Isabel I Give the Whole of the plantation whereon I now Live During her Natural and at her death I desire that the Land shall Be sold and the money arising from the sale of said Land to be Equally divived among all my children To my Wife I also give two horses and two plows & harness & I also Give to my Wife two cows & calves 2d To the deacons of the New Bethel Church I Give one hundred dollars for the Benefit of said church But in case of the dissolution of said Church then in that case I desire that the said money Shall Be Returned and come again into the hands of my Executors to Be disposed of as my other property---to the deacons of said church I also Give the sum of seventy five dollars to be by them disposed of in the Baptist or Burmah Mission-- 3d to Melissa my Daughter I Give one Cow & calf, I then desire that the Whole Balance of my property of Every Discription shall be sold and the money arising there from to Be Equally divided among & Between My sons James Robison, Clark Robison, James Biggers my son in law William--Qwinn Robert Robison also my Gransons James Wilson William Samuel & Samuel Wilson to have a Share Divided among them My Book I wish to be Equally Divided among all my children And I desire my Wife Isabella Robison & my son James Robison shall be Executors to this my Last Will and do

hereby Revoke & disannul all other will by me heretofore
made in witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 11th day
of March 1838
