Rowell of York District and State of South Carolina Revokeing all others appoint this my last will and testament first I lend unto my beloved Wife Betsy Rowell my plantation whereon I now live also I lend unto her two negro men one named Randol the other Isom also two Horses one called Jack and the other called Ribbin also three Feather beds and the furniture on them also plantation tools for two hands to work with also kitchen furnitmes sufficient for her all these things during her natural life second I wish all my Books to be equally devied among all my children except my margin Bible which I give to my wife and I give my large Bible to my daughter Mary A Rowell also I give my daughter Mary A Rowell one young mare called pigion also I give to All my seven daughters two feather beds each with common funiture betsy forman has Received hers already I also give twelve dollars to each of my daughters Lissing with me now to purchase a buro apiece Mary A Rowell and Nancy W Rowell has got this already I have given to my Son Benjamin Rowell one horse which I Rated to him at fifty dollars as being part of his heir of my estate also I give to my beloved Wife two notes one on Dr. Edmond Janings and the other on Carson's Estate I also give ten dollars to be manager of the Methodist fund of special Relief also I give to my three Sons Benjamin D Rowell William A Rowell Thomas C. H. Rowell one feather Bed and furniture apiece or one to each all the Remainder of my moveable property not mentioned my will is that it be thrown or put into ten equal parts agreeable to the apraisement of it then let each of my children draw for their part as I wish an equal

division and none of my moveable property Sold first let my Daughter Mary A Rowell draw then nancy W Rowell draw then Sally C Rowell draw then Betsy F Formon then Benjamin D Rowell then Milley E Rowell then Hanah I Rowell then Pegga C Rowell then William A Rowell than Thomas E H Rowell James I Formand his wife Betsy forman has had one hundred and ninety seven dollars as part of there part of my Estate which must be taken out of their part and Equal divied among the other nine of my children my Will is that all my children now liveing with me live with there Mother during her natural life after my decease they can draw this part and do the best with it they can except William and S'd Thomas C H. I wish their Mother to be guardian for them after the death of my wife my will is that Randol and Isom beck sam and palance live with any of my children that they care after the death of my beloved wife my wish is that my land be equally divied among all my ten children and my wish is that about three or four of my children purchase the land and pay up the others their parts I wis my son Benjamin to be one but if they cannot fulfill my wish in this I suppose it must be sold and the mony equally devied among the ten I appoint my beloved Son Benjamin D Rowell and my beloved daughter Mary A Rowell as my Executor and Executrix of this my last will and testament
