Abner M. Willans Will
In the Name of God Amen.
I, Abner M. Willans of Dallas County, State of Alabama
Planter being now in tolerable health and of Sound mind
and disposing Memory do make and Execute this my last
Will and Testament in the words and terms following to wit:
First I desire that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be
paid. Second I Will and bequeath to my daughter, Malinda
M. Willans my Carriage and that horse I usually work in it
and my Negro Man, Hutson, who usually drives the Carriage.
Third I set the Remainder of my personal and real estate, both
and rights and Credits, I Will to be equally divided among my
my Children, viz: Daniel M. Willans, and Irwin M. Willans,
My Cuda M. Willans, Susan Ann Braggs, Sady Braggs
and Abby Hutson, by Commissioners appointed by the
Orphans Court, share and share alike.
Fourth I Will and Wish all my lands sold by my Executors,
at public Sale on a Credit of Twelve Months, thirty days
Notice of time and place of Sale, being first given by adver-
tisement in some news paper published in the County and
the proceeds to be equally divided among my Children above
named. Fifth The Shares of my Estate falling to my
daughters to be for their Special and Separate use and
benefit during their Natural lives, each and not to be
subject to the Control or liable to the debts of their or
either of their Husbands, and then to be equally divided
amongst the lawful heirs of their bodies, viz: each daughter
Children to have their Mothers Shares. And for the purpose
of carrying out my intention in this respect the Court to
appoint a Trustee for each of my said daughters, who
shall in no instance be the husband of either of my daughters.
Sixth I nominate and appoint my Son Irwin M. Willans
William D. McCall and James Henry Blount Executors of this my
last Will and Testament, fully revoking all other and former
wills by me heretofore made. And Testimony Whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 1st day of
September 1845

M. Moses Haskew Son of the County of Dallas & State
of Alabama, now of Sound and Disposing Mind but
being Mindful of My Mortality do this in the year of our
Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & Forty, make
and publish this My last Will and Testament in the
following manner, that is to say, first I appoint my
two sons William Haskew and Melior Haskew my
executors to this My Will & Testament, and second at my
death I desire to be decently buried in a Christian like
manner, and thirdly I desire that all of my just debts
and funeral Expenses be paid, and, fourthly I give
all my property both Real & Personal that, I the Testator
of To My Wife Polly Haskew and my three daughters,
(viz) Susan Haskew, Sarah Haskew, and Eliza
Haskew, and it is my wish that the property both Real
& Personal be kept together by my Executors as the Common
Joint Property of my Wife Polly Haskew & my three daugh-
ters Susan, Sarah & Eliza, in equal Shares in Common
and at the death of my Wife and it should be divided
by my daughters above named, and if divided by my
Executors then for them to divide the property equally
between my three daughters, Susan Sarah & Eliza, for
their use & benefit. In Testimony Whereof I have
