I Adam Liddlow, Wm.
In the name of God Amen. I Adam Liddlow,
of the County of Dallas and State of Alabama being
a law State of health & mind, but sound in mind
and Memory, I think be to good. And knowing that
it is appointed unto all men to die, do this 27 day
of April in the year of our Lord 1849 Make this my
Last Will and Testament in manner and form as
following. First as soon after my decease or inevitably
I can be done I wish all my Just debt to be
paid and if my debts cannot be paid without selling
property to do so I wish my land to be sold for
that purpose, and payments made. And after all
my Just debts are paid I do give to my beloved
Wife, Obedience Liddlow, all and every part and
portion of the remaining part of my Estate both
real and personal to her and she hold the same
during her Natural life or Widowhood And after
the decease or marriage of my aforesaid Wife
Obedience Liddlow I give and bequeath to William
A. Hoyle & certain Negro Girl named Tempy and to
M. D. Rose I give and bequeath a certain Negro
boy named Hader. After the death of my Wife as aforesaid
I wish all the land which house hold & other things
belonging to my Estate, Excepting the Negroes sold, and
all the Negroes, together with the money obtained by the
Sale of the land and stock to be divided in four
equal lots to be drawn for by my children or names
(children) To wit to my son Lewis Liddlow I give and
bequeath one of the four lots above mentioned but to
be held in Trust by William Thompson and Augustus Hood
both of the County of Tuscaloosa and State of Alabama,
and in no case the subject to the debt or contract of my
son Lewis Liddlow but to be held by the said Trust
in trust, for the sole use and benefit of my son Lewis
Liddlow during his Natural life and after his death
to be equally divided between his Children And to
my son Adam Liddlow I give and bequeath one
lot of the four lots above mentioned. But should he
die without a Child or children I wish that
part or lot of my Estate to be equally divided

witness my other three Children named in this my
 last Will and Testament, but my Wife to be substituted
 out of the same during her life. And my daughter Wm
 never William Wm and her right one to be the above men-
 tioned year later, but not to be subject to the debt or
 contracts of him, his land William Williams or any of the
 person but to be for his sole use and benefit during his
 Natural life and after his death to be equally divided
 between his three youngest Children namely Charles P
 King Esq. Mary King Ada Adam King and to my
 son Aaron Sedlow - I give and bequeath one lot to
 the year 1849 a provision for his benefit and the benefit
 of his heirs. And having given direction for
 the distribution of my estate, I appoint my beloved
 Wife Obadiah Sedlow Executor to execute this my
 last Will and Testament according to the intent
 and meaning thereof. And I do hereby declare
 this to be my last Will and Testament bearing
 all others by me heretofore made. In Witness
