my beloved wife Lucy Crocker, to be executrix to my will and testament
I do bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy Crocker, my houses and plantation
all my personal property, viz; Horses Cows and Calves, my hogs of every
description, my bees and beehives, kitchen and household furniture of every
description, my plantation tools and cooper tools all to be her property during
her life time or widowhood. It is my wish and desire that my beloved wife Lucy
Crocker to give my beloved son Ludmus Crocker as good education, and all
the rest of my children, viz; George Crocker, William Crocker, Carey Crocker
Thos yard Crocker, Crawford Crocker, Willam Crocker, Monroe Crocker, Louisa
Crocker, Hattie Wilson, Mary Crocker and Anne Crocker One dollar each, and
my just debts to be paid. This is my last will and testament. Other wills
and testaments are hereby revoked. Given under my hand and seal this 9th
day of July 1825. (signed) Erury Crocker. Signed sealed and delivered
in presence of us John Reardon, Dago R Windham Johnth Moseley.

 First I resign my Soul unto the Lord, I brought by God
 hoping and believing in a remission of my sins by the merits
 and mediation of Jesus Christ, and my body I commit to
 the earth to be buried at the discretion of my friends and
 executors hereafter mentioned, my worldly estate I give and
 bequeath as follows, first my will is that all my debts
 be paid without trouble or suits of law. Secondly I lend
 unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Barnett until the first day
 of January eighteen hundred and thirty all my estate both
 Real and Personal after the payment of all my debts
 debts except such as are agreed otherwise viz. my Land,
 my Slaves my stock of every kind my plantations tools household
 and kitchen furniture and every other part of my property
 that has not been mentioned until the time above mentioned nor is
 my wife to remove of the plantation where she now lives any
 of my property without the consent of my executors within
 the above named time. Thirdly my will is that after the first
 day of January eighteen hundred and thirty all my estate both
 Real and Personal be divided between my wife and the rest of my
 lawful heirs in the manner and form as is prescribed by the laws
 of the State in which I now live, and my will is in case my wife
 dies before the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty
 that there shall ^{not} be any division of my estate amongst my heirs
 until the expiration of the above mentioned time. And I do hereby
 utterly now and disavow all other of my wills and testament heretofore
 made owning and acknowledging this to be and no other to be my last will and
 testament And for the prosecution thereof do appoint empower and
 authorize William Barnett and James Olds executors to this my
