I Ann Ballard of Dallas County and State of Alabama being sick but of perfect mind and memory do by and with the consent of my husband William S Ballard ordain and make this (in part) my last Will and Testament (Viz) That is to say knowing and bearing to mind that I have two old Servants one a man the other a woman named Miller and Sally who have with honesty & fidelity served sustained and labored for me from my Childhood until this day. Now therefore be it known that from this period or after my decease that they be perfectly free and clear from the control of any person or persons whatever so long that they are able to get their ^{own} living. But should they by old age sickness or decrepitude become disabled so that they may need support, then it is my will and desire that my executor or administrator do and shall maintain ~~the~~ and support them the remainder of their natural life -
