William Conway Executors to this my last will and Testament. In
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of
August 1821. Edward Conway (I signed & sealed in the presence of
Samuel Lee Samuel Erwine. Which said last will and Testament so
produced was duly proven in court by the oath of Samuel Lee and
Samuel Erwine the two subscribing witnesses thereto as the law directs
and recorded. And thereupon the said William C. Hogan and Charles
J. Porter two of the Executors in said Will named with the leave of
the court in open court took upon themselves the execution thereof
were qualified as Executors and entered into bond and security for their
faithful performance as such as the said directs all of which was

and my worldly Estate disposed of in the following manner. I will
and bequeath two thirds of my estate real & personal to the children of my
Sister Mary Hole & to belong to her heirs forever but she is to have the
use of it till they respectively arrive at lawful age. I will and bequeath
to Margarette E. Sato daughter of Caleb Sato one negro girl named
Delphy to belong to her & her heirs forever. It is my will & desire that
a female Slave named Letitia now about three or four years old be
inmanumitted and that my Executors do apply to the Legislature for

William Woods all the remainder and residue of my property not
before mentioned to be equally divided among them to belong to them
and their heirs forever. I do hereby authorize my executors to
transfer all lands certificates to John Heale that he has heretofore
transferred to me. I do hereby nominate & appoint my friends Cole
Wale & George Phillips Executors of this my last will & testament.

fourty four & five together with all other property held by me in the
Town of Cahaba either on my own separate account or jointly
with my aforesaid Brother David. I do give and bequeath unto
him the said David Crockeron subject to the debts which I now do
or may owe at the time of my death. And I do further give and
bequeath unto my Brother David Crockeron the whole of my part
of an undivided moiety of the Quarter Section known as Section 15,
in the East & South West Quarter of that one Township fifteen in Range
nine. And I do further declare that my will and intention is that the
whole property both real & personal which I own is to vest in and
become the property of my Brother David Crockeron. And I do hereby
nominate and appoint my said Brother David Crockeron sole Executor
of this my last will & Testament Signed sealed & published this 5th day
