Bartholomew Smith's will
In the name of God Amen

I Bartholomew Smith
of the County of Dallas and State of Alabama, being yet in
health and in the expectation of death but sound in mind
and in full possession of my reason do hereby and herein make
again and declare on this nineteenth day of June A.D. 1864
this my last will and testament, revoking all others
Item 1. My body I desire to be decently interred in the
public burial ground at I close upon a square of ground
which I desire my Executor to be hereinafter appointed, to
purchase and have timely in close, my soul I command to go
trusting for its reunion with the body at the last day and
its everlasting salvation to the merits of Jesus Christ Our
Lord to whom be glory and honor forever and ever Amen
Item 2. I desire all the expenses necessary for my funeral to be paid
and paid and I do hereby authorize the payment of One
Thousand dollars to Mrs. Dony Ann Hall to be by her appoin-
tuted to the purchase of suitable monuments to be placed on
the remains of my wife, wife and her infant son and the ent-
ombing of the same with a handsome railing of iron should the
said sum of One Thousand dollars be not sufficient I will be
gave to the said Mrs. Dony Ann Hall power to draw upon
my Executors for the sum which may be wanting after the
One Thousand dollars have been expensed and hereby direct my
Executor to pay said balance etc the inscription on the monument
I leave to the direction and task of the said Mrs. Hall

Item 3^d I direct my Executor to disinter the remains
of my little Son Jacob dear son and my Father, and
reinter them in the grave yard at Schenck upon the sum
dictated to be paid above, my said Executor are also
directed to appropriate a sum of money to the purchase and
erecture of head stone marble monuments for my Father my
little Son Jacob & myself myself The amount of the sum
is left indeterminate because I am ignorant of the cost but I
desire it should be ample I desire my friend the Rev.
J. W. C. Pinckney to furnish appropriate inscriptions for
the same.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mrs. Harriet
the body of Land upon which I now reside known as the
Mind of Land purchased by me from John & Cole and
acquired in all Andrew Hosman and apply the same more
or less in fee simple with all the house hold and
belonging furniture of any and every description together
with my Coach and horses Buggy and the horse buggy
and carriage I also give and bequeath to her of her
Agree of the following names to wit, Dick Malina
Pleasant County Little Fox Rachel Adeline Martha
Alpha Big Jim Malina Amy Foster Brown
Marta Fayette Cynthia Isabel and her Child Francis
Vicent Maria 13th Ted Mary and her Child David

Item 6th I direct my Executor to divide the body of land
known as the Lower plantation which is Acres 180
Consideration of my physical weakness I cannot more
more accurately describe Containing in all Thats to the
Hosman's acres more or less (embracing Sixty acres more
or less belonging to a minor heir of Sophie Walker deceased
which I direct my Executor to purchase whenever it may
be done) into three parts equal in quantity and quality and
to sell off and assign One part to my son James Bennett

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a grand son & to my son Bas & a third part to my son Garland
Gardner which my Executors have made the above division dead
assignment I desire and hereby direct that they take the patents or
other minumum of titles and ascertain the quantity and number
embraced by each assignment which when ascertained I direct
to be recorded in the County Court Clerk's Office of Dallas County
the ensuing assignment to be recorded separately

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son James Bennett
the 1st part or parcel of land which my Executors may assign
him according to the direction of Item 6th in fee simple I also
give and bequeath to my son James Bennett the following named
agents to wit Harry Jason Boley In just Child of Susan and
Frank Lucy his wife Solomon Ruth Beck Alon Lucy
Bole, Angelina King Mary Ann Washington, Griffin, Mathew
James Little, Will, Lewis, Clark, Silas Oley, Oliver, Peter,
Oleah, Silas, Ruth, Nancy, William, his son Big Almon
Young Hamer her Child Robert and infant daughter, and
named Miles Chaney, Samuel Major, Faking, Cotton, Weston,
Franna Little Boley (Miles Daughter) Catharine, old Faking
maching, in all Forty Six in number

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son John the 1st part
of land which my Executors may assign him according to the
direction of Item 6th in fee simple I also give and bequeath
to my son Bas the following named men to wit Almon
Little Jason Soddy, Junette Judy Charles Cynthia Beck
Old Post Boley, John Settler Leah Parker George Little John
Thomas R. Frank Anna Eliza Little Anna Silar Dutton
Major Emma, son's and infant, boy and named Anna and
other child Anna Kainey and infant Bas and named
Cesud Margaret Tilda Lucy Friday Mary Faking Jane
Henry Little Mary Martha, Sam maching in all forty two
in number

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my son Gardner Gardner
the 1st part or parcel of land which my Executors may assign
him according to the direction of Item 6th in fee simple I
also give and bequeath to my son Gardner Gardner the four
wip named agents to wit Edmund Louisiana Philip Nathan Louis
Anna, infant, boy and named Immanuel, Royal Connor Chaney
Chloe Weller Allen Safe, Phillip Sist Terry Sylvie Minerva
Sylvia infant, boy and named Nicholas Peter Little Rachel
Wharri John Racel Sod, Anna Leah Arthur, Pauline Leathia
Diley Infant maturing in all forty One in number

Item 10th I desire and direct that all the stock (except what
has been given and bequeathed to my beloved wife Rebecca and
recorded in Item 5th) consisting of hogs, mules, sheep, dogs
etc together with all the wagons (except the two best)

Wages given and bequeathed specially to my wife Rebecca
and other farming utensils to be divided by my Executor into
four equal parts and distributed between my wife Rebecca
and my three sons.

* This 11th I desire and direct that the property given and
bequeathed above to my three sons may be kept together, and
marked properly under the superintendence of a Common Councillor
until the child's first birth of age I desire however and so
direct my Executor after paying the expenses of the plantation
to convey a third part of the interest of the said Real estate at the
end of each year and to give a legal interest the amount
of one third of my said separately. I desire the accounts of
each to be kept separately and the expenses of maintenance
and education to be apportioned out of their separate funds or
otherwise I hereby appoint my beloved wife Rebecca and my
friend Oakland J. Gardner Peter R. Hyatt if I dies
Mr. Cuver joint Guardians of my children and earnestly
request them to have them liberally educated and carefully
and prudently brought up.

This 12th all the money which may remain over after
paying my just and honest debts and paying the expenses
incurred on this 2nd & 3rd day in paying the expenses of
winding up my estate I desire and direct to be equally
distributed equally between my wife and three sons.

This 13th I give and bequeath to William B. Mayall in
Trust for the sole use and benefit of Susan D. Foster
during her natural life and at her death to the heirs of
her body absolutely a tract of Land bought by me from Mr.
Premier Ward Containing Eighty acres being and situate
in the County of Dallas also another tract of Land bought
by me from James Gardner number of acres not known
upon which Mr. Oliver O'Carroll resides residing upon
said tract Eighty acres which I purchased and bequeath
to the said Mr. Oliver O'Carroll and his sole and separate use
being in the County of Dallas I also give and bequeath to the
said William B. Mayall in Trust for the sole use and
benefit of the said Susan D. Foster and at her death to the
heirs of her body absolutely the following named negroes to
viz. Nancy, Henry, Wesley, Marie S., Hannah, infant Elia
not named Jim, Hannah Lucy, Adelia, Celia, Remond
Mary Simon, Obey, Old man Jim & Hancy numbering
in all six now.

This 14th Reciting a deed of Trust upon certain negroes
the names and number of which I do not recollect to know
me in the event of having certain debts to pay for some
of Lucy said deed having been given by said Lucy to Francis

I have for my use and benefit and wased in the Office of
the County Court Clerk Office of Orange County I hereby
give and bequeath all my right title and interest legal and
equitable in the property secured and governed by said will
of James to Mrs Martha Ann Tracy her sole and separate
use and at her death to her settle by Isab Smith

Item 15th my Child watch and Chain I give and bequeath
to my son Isab to be worn by him whenever his Guardian
determine that he is of suitable age

Item 16 Having some promising note in my possession
and the first of John Pennington and myself I hereby direct
my Executor whenever said note are collected to reserve One
third of the amount of said note and to pay One third to
Mr Pennington and One third to Mrs Pennington's Coll and
to take their wages, give the same said note unpayable to me
individually. Two of the notes are due from John Pennington
for Seven Hundered & Twenty dollars One thousand One hundred
and Sixty four or third note is an Isab C Garrison
giving debt of payable in 1848.

Item 17 I hereby direct my Executor to pay to Mr. Caroline
Hanson Five hundred and twenty dollars with all the interest
due to the amount of which she has a mortgage on certain
land and hazard I desire that the money may be paid at no
earlier a day as practicable and the property where I, the
holder of land to my wife I failed to recd from the same
time truly given her side to \$100 my 14 Decr the tract
Commenc'd the corner of Davis yard fence and road
so come east and north the depth of a quarter section I
direct my Executor to make him a deed of the same for him
a Colored man an emancipated servant of my father's
honor my 13nd of Oct to a certain tract of land I hereby
direct my Executor to make him one necessary deed to
the same I furthermore in Consideration of my respect and
affection for Tom give and bequeath to him five hundred
dollars and direct my Executor to pay him the same prior
to the distribution of the money provided for in item 12
Having the day given the Recd John H Lincoln a
Chanting note On Peter A. Williamson for five hundred
dollars due in 1846 I hereby declare that the half of said
note is given to the said John H Lincoln individually
in Consideration of my friendship and esteem for him and
therfore half to the said John H Lincoln if the completion
of St Paul's Church School on paying the debt of the same
as he may determine I also hereby direct my Executor to
execute the same upon the schedule of my addition give him
my legal aid in their power in collecting the same I also

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herself desirous of my friend Ward M. Clark to assume the
Cognizance of my ward Caroline and Cecilia
Smith Clark's remaining account against Mrs Susan
H. Lee and Dr James T Gee I hereby relinquish the
same to them and declare them Cancelled and released
in full my Executed to receipt the same, Meaning
her Purse claim in my employ as ditcher for several
years by Contract with him and willing I instruct my
Carer to ascertain my indebtedness and pay him
out of my wherers may be due.

The above and foregoing is de-
clared to be my last will and testament and I hereby
appoint Regan J Smith Gardiner T Gardiner Peter
R Dugoff and Paul M Clark the Executors of this
my last will and testament to carry into effect all and
singular directions and provisions I hereby give them
full power and authority to sell and dispose of any
and Estate or personal property not desired or required
after they have paid to the State of my state
or to the intent of my testator and to do any thing which
in their judgment may be for the benefit of the parties
