Catharine Logan Will

- The State of South Carolina In the name of God
amen We Catharine Logan St Bartholomews, Wid-
ow do make public and declare my last will and
testament in manner following. In the first
place I desire all my Just and legal debts to be
fully paid and satisfied I give to my Executor and Executrix
herein after named my faithful servant Daphne
in the confidence that they will protect and take care
of her for the rest of the life without exacting labor or
service from her and that they will allow the sum
of Ten Dollars Annually for so long as she may live
for her maintenance and support and I direct
the aforesaid sum of Ten Dollars annually to be a charge
upon my estate all the rents and in the following
residue of my estate I give to my children in the

following manner. One moiety thereof to my
Son Benjamin S. Loggan trust for my daughter
Martha Mary Chipman for and during her natural
life for her sole and separate use; and not liable or
subject to the debts or engagements of her present or
any future husband, and so after her decease in
trust for her children living at the time of her
death equally to be divided between them if more
than one and if not more, then in trust for the one
that may be living at the time of her death; and
I hereby authorize the said Benjamin S. Loggan
by and with the consent of her the said Martha
Mary Chipman to sell and dispose of any part or
of the whole of the estate hereby bequeathed to her
in real estate or proceeds or purchase money in realty or
Bank Stock or in other goods or estate for the same
use and upon the same trusts and subjects to the
same limitations. And in case my daughter should
die without leaving any ^{children} children living at
the time of her death, I then give and bequeath
the above moiety of real estate or the proceeds thereof
to my son Benjamin S. Loggan for ever. The
other moiety of my estate I give and bequeath
to my son Benjamin S. Loggan for his use during
his natural life and from and after his decease
to such child or children of my son as may be
living at the time of his death. But if my
son should die without any children lawfully
begotten living at the time of his death then
I give the estate hereby bequeathed to him
to my daughter for the same use as are herein
expressed that is to say for sole and separate use so
long as she may live and after her death to
such child or children of her as may be living
at the time of her death. And lastly I man-
nfully constitute and appoint my Son Benjamin
S. Loggan and my daughter Martha Mary
Chipman Executors and Executrix of this my
last will and testament; hereby King all
other and former Wills by me at any time made
and declaring this to be and contain my last
will and testament. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal the Eighteenth day
of February in the year of our Lord One thousand

my last will and Testament hereby revoking all
