

In the name of God Amen. I Charles M. Lawson of Warren County  
State of Mississippi being sick of body but of sound mind & memory do hereby make  
this my last will and Testament, to wit. In case of my death I give and  
bequeath to Eliza Auburn of Hinds County Mississippi out of my Estate  
the sum of three hundred dollars to be applied to the completion of her  
education or otherwise for her use & benefit. To the widow & heirs of the  
late stable Auburn Esq. of Hinds County Mississippi I give out of my  
Estate the sum of five hundred dollars. To the heirs of Mary Smith  
wife of Samuel Smith of the said County of Hinds and their heirs  
forever I give and bequeath my negro man Sangerfield. To my sister  
Violet wife of Jeremiah Powell of Georgia. I give and bequeath my  
negro woman Charlotte forever. All monies due me from my brother  
Roger Lawson and Archibald McIntire of Jeremiah Powell shall be  
equally divided between my brother Roger Lawson & my sister Hannah  
McIntire, Mary Kerley, Violet Powell, Margaret Stovine and Alice  
Glambden. All my lands in the State of Mississippi & Alabama  
I wish to be sold as soon as practicable and the proceeds equally divided  
between my brother Roger Lawson and all my sisters. The remainder  
of my negroes not herein above bequeathed, it is my desire shall be sent  
to the State of Georgia to be there equally divided between my brother  
and my sisters. The debts due from James L. Johnson of Louisiana  
I desire shall be collected as soon as practicable, and with all other debts  
due me to be likewise equally divided between my brother & sisters.  
Every species of my personal property not above mentioned I devise to  
be sold, and after paying my just debts to be equally divided in  
like manner among my sisters & brother, except my survey or  
compass & chain which I give to Joseph M. Craven of Hinds  
County and his heirs forever. I hereby appoint Samuel Smith  
Epitaph Fitz and Joseph M. Craven of Hinds County and State of  
Mississippi, and Jeremiah Powell of the State of Georgia to be the  
Executors of this my last will and Testament. In testimony where-  
of I hereunto set my hand & seal this sixteenth day of Decr. Eight-  
een hundred and twenty seven. It is my desire & request that my Exec-  
utors above named should not be under the necessity of giving security  
for the faithful performance of their trust, and that they employ  
Haze Caldwell of Hinds County Miss. as agent or attorney at  
law to attend to the adjustment of the concerns of my Estate

And an orphan's Court began & held in & for the County of Warren State  
of Mississippi on the fourth Monday of December 1827 The last will &  
Testament of Charles Lawson dec'd was this day produced in Court by  
Samuel Smith one of the Exors herein named and proved by the oaths  
of James Hillbourn Charles M. Lawson Junr and Jas. M. Black  
three of the subscribing witnesses thereto and the same was thereupon  
admitted to probate whereupon on application of the said

Samuel Smith by the will of the dec<sup>d</sup>. not being liable to give security and he having taken the oath required by law, It is ordered by the court that letters of Executorship be granted him in due form. And afterwards at an orphans Court began & held for the county aforesaid on the fourth Monday of January 1828. Joseph McClorahan one of the Executors named in the last will & testament of Charles McClorahan deceased came into court & took the oath prescribed by law as Executor aforesaid. And on his application it is ordered that a warrant do issue to wraik Glasgow, Oliver C Brooks, John D Fox, William Bacon & David Eastman to appraise the personal estate of said deceased and report the same to the next term of this court. And afterwards to wit at an orphans court began and held in & for the county aforesaid on the fourth Monday of July 1828.

On application of Jeremiah Powell one of the Exors named in the last will and testament of Charles McClorahan dec<sup>d</sup>. It is ordered by the Court that letters of Executorship be granted him on his taking the oath (he not being required to enter into bond by said will, whereupon he took the oath prescribed by law. It is thereupon ordered that letters be granted him in due form. State of Mississippi Warren County let.
