The State of Alabama Dallas County In the Name
of God Amen I Daniel H. Norwood of the County &
State aforesaid being in full health but of sound mind
and memory do hereby Write and execute this my last
Will and Testament. After the payment of all my just
debts and ~~in full satisfaction of all my just debts and~~
the children of my son William Norwood I desire that my
body should be decently buried with out pomp or show
I desire that all my just debts be paid for this purpose
if my Executors shall find it necessary I desire that the
following named Negroes be sold upon such terms as
may be deemed proper or most advisable (Viz) Betty
& Child Edward Rees Dick Freda or so many of them as
may be necessary. I desire that every thing my wife

afforded my Dear Mother Hannah Newood give
her Comfort & Support during her life & that she remain
a member of the family as heretofore. Fourthly I Will
and bequeath to my beloved Children all the remaining
part of my property both real and personal of whatever
nature or kind to be equally divided between them
such division to take place as they severally arrive
of age and furthermore that portion of my personal
property that may be allotted to each of my Daughters
I Will should be entered on record by the Names in the
office of the Orphans Court of Dallas County or such other
County as the division may take place as also the
Name of the Legatee who may receive the same which
said Negroes & their increase I Will to my beloved Daugh-
ters Rachel & Annally and to the heirs of their body & should
either of them die without issue then & in that case the
personal property she may have received to revert back
to and be equally divided between the remaining Legates
Fifthly Having full Confidence in the Skill & Judgment
Fidelity of those my Executors whom I shall hereafter
appoint to carry out the provisions of this Instrument
It is my Will & I do hereby give power them to make
& assent to George A B Walker to that part of my
plantation that I have recently sold him on his complying
with his part of the Contract and also to make sale of
the residue of the plantation on which I now reside
and to make better there to and furthermore to purchase
any other plantation or tract of Land that they in their
Judgment may think best, Calculated to promote the inter-
est of my Estate. Sixthly I Will that the property be kept
together and the proceeds of the Farm or so much of
the same as may be deemed necessary be employed for
the Support & Education of my Children their Education
to be as liberal as their means may justify. Seventhly
I do hereby nominate Constables & appoint my Friends
Lewis J Moore and John Paulding jointly my Executors
to carry into effect this my last Will & Testament hereby
~~Bequeathing~~ all other and former Wills by me at any
time heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have

In the Name of God Amen I S. Warden of
the State of Alabama Dallas County being distressed
in mind and body and of disposing memory but
knowing the uncertainty of Death do make and publish
this as my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as follows (Viz). I bequeath all of my Estate of
every description both Real Personal and Personal after
the payment of my Just Debts unto my dearly beloved
Wife Mary Warden during her Natural life or life
or until the coming of age my youngest child to
enable him to raise said educate my children and
it is my Will and Desire that in case my Wife
should die before the coming of age of my
youngest child I will and I do bequeath and I do
give unto my said child until his Death. It is my Will
that a division of all my estate shall take place at
the time of my Wife's Marriage and to be equally divided
between her and my children and Susan D. Ward
in case my Wife should die before the coming of
age of my youngest child it is my Will that an equal
division shall take place at his death between all of
my children then living and Susan D. Ward
