In the first place I recommend my soul to god who gave it and my body to the earth. I secondly after my executors have paid all my just debts the balance of my estate both real and personal I will to be equally divided between my beloved wife Nancy Carson, Thomas Brantley Carson and Joseph Matt Carson, and after the death of my beloved wife her part which I will and bequeath her to be equally divided among the lawful heirs of her body My next will and desire is that David Carson son my brother be one of my executors Harris Brantley and Carter Cleveland my other executors to act in this my present will. Signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us this twenty fifth day of May Eighteen hundred and twenty six.
