 In the Name of God Amen I Edward Lloyd Hill of the County and
 State of said being sound in mind But Weak and Afflicted
 And Well Knowing the Casualties incident to this life do make
 And declare this my last Will and Testament Infirmity
 is my Will And desire that all my Just debts be paid Out
 of my Estate as also my funeral Expenses &c. I give
 bequeath unto my beloved Nephew Edward Lloyd Jr.
 the following described Tract of Land Situate lying and
 being in the County of Dallas and State of said And within
 the described district of Land Subject to Sale at Public Sale to wit
 The West half of the South West quarter of Section Seven
 Township Section of Range Nine Containing Eighty 40/100
 Acres And the North West quarter and West half of the North
 West quarter of Section Eighteen and Township Section of
 Range Nine Containing Two Hundred and Forty 60/100
 Acres also the South East quarter of the South West quarter
 of Section Seven Township Section of Range Nine Containing
 Forty 20/100 Acres also the North East of the South West
 quarter of Section Seven Township Section of Range Nine
 Containing Forty 20/100 Acres also the South West of the North
 East Quarter of Section Eighteen of Township Section of
 Range Nine Containing Forty 20/100 Acres I give
 and bequeath unto my beloved Nephew Edward Lloyd Jr. the
 following named Slaves To wit One Man follows Solomon aged
 forty five Henry a Woman aged thirty five her six Children
 Martin aged ten years Jane aged eight years Sylvester aged
 six years Charles aged five years Milton aged three years
 Oliver and infant about five months and Henry a slave aged
 about fifty years See a follow aged about thirty years Jim a slave
 aged about twenty three years William aged about twenty
 three years Ben a boy aged fourteen years Candace a woman
 aged sixty years Mary a Woman aged about thirty years
 Elizabeth aged about twenty years and her six Children Benjamin
 about five years of age and Jack about three years of age
 Together with all my household and kitchen furniture Stock
 off Wag and Cattle Horses &c as also all Notes bonds and other
 evidences of debt due and to become due to me after my decease
 as also all Monies which I may have at my decease together
 with the Crop growing at the time of my decease together
 with all other things which I may be possessed of at the time
 of my decease not herein particularly bequeathed I give
 I do hereby Order and Appoint the said Edward Lloyd Jr.
 my executor of this my last Will and Testament

My Testimony being I have known & set my hand and
Seal in presence of Miles A. Wilcox Joseph W. Cutler and
Archibald W. Bony who usually signed their names as
Witnesses in presence of each other after witnessing the
Signature of the Testator here on the 31st day of October
1841

James Callen's Will

I James Callen of the County of Dallas and State of
Alabama do hereby make and publish this to be my
Last Will and Testament: revoking all others heretofore
made. Item the first My Wife and desire is that
my Wife Eliza Callen shall have the use of my
plantation or such part that will be sufficient for
her use also three negroes of her own choice two
Horses such as she likes Ten first Choice of Hogs
Two hundred bushels Corn with all the plantation tools
one Hog pen and all Kitchen furniture all of which
I leave to her during her natural life and at
her Death my Wife and desire is that all the
property that I have bequeathed my Wife Eliza Callen shall
be equally divided between William Callen Elizabeth
George Mary Charlotte and Anna Martin all of
which I give to them and their heirs forever Item
the 3rd I bequeath to my daughter Catherine Callen
one negro woman to be chosen by herself after her
Mother has made choice of her three negroes also one
