

I Elizabeth Campbell do make this my last will and testament 50
I will and bequeath unto my son Victor Moreau Campbell part of the Lot I now
live on no 55 that lies below the house striking a straight line from the end
of my Dwelling House to the lot now owned by Jesse Boone to include the stable

The upper part that contains my buildings, well Garden and every thing
that is on that part of the lot, I will and bequeath to my daughters, Mary
Letitia and Caroline, all to have equal parts and if either or both of the young
Girls marry, before Mary, she is still to retain the house. Moreau is also to
live with them. if he pleases after his education is completed, he is to stay here
until he is done his education and it is to be paid out of the income of the
house if Mary marries the house and Lot must be equally divided between
my three Daughters above mentioned and if Mary never marries at her death
the houses and lot goes to Letitia and Caroline or their heirs, the household
furniture is to be equally divided, with Mary Letitia Caroline and Moreau
in this way, if one gets married, then she is to have her share, and in the same
manner all is to be divided as they want it but all stay together until death or
marriage separates them, it is my will that my daughter Penelope stays here as
she has done and her two daughters as there is a plenty of house room, it is my
will that my fractional lot be divided into small lots, that my son Moreau
has choice, and the other to be sold my land and other debts paid out of the
money arising from the sale, and if any should be left to go to Moreau and
his three sisters Mary Letitia and Caroline, my bottle Case I give to Moreau
I do will and bequeath to my son Moreau two negro Girls to wit: Molly and
Rebecca. I do will and bequeath to Mary one negro Girl by the name of Fanny
I do will and bequeath to Letitia one negro Girl by the name of Betty. I do
will and bequeath to Caroline one negro girl by the name of Aggy, what
horses or Cattle I have is to be for the use of all while they stay together, and
if any marries, they are still to stay for the use of those that stay in
the house. I do will and bequeath to my son Victor Moreau Campbell
my tract of land it being the south east quarter of section number 20
Township no 14 of Range no 10 containing one hundred and sixty acres
I do hereby appoint Thomas Campbell and Carlisle Humphreys Executors
and Mary Campbell executrix. October 31st 1820. Elizabeth Campbell (Seal)
