Elizabeth P. Tabb's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth P. Tabb of
the County of Dallas and State of Alabama late of
Mecklenburg County Virginia do make and ordain this
my last will and testament in manner and form
as follows to wit: I desire that the tract of land given
in the County of Mecklenburg Virginia conveyed to me
by deed of gift from Samuel Gooder, John S Raven,
Scoft and Richard Boyd dated the 16th of October 1817
which said land is particularly described and set forth
in said deed, be sold for the best price that can be obtained
by my executors and the money divided in the following
manner to wit one third of the money to be paid to my
son Aristed Tabb One other third to my daughter Sally
L Tabb and the remaining third to be equally divided
among my sons John Tabb Samuel G Tabb Thomas Tabb
and Henry Tabb. 1st I give to my son John Tabb one
silver table and a Spinning Wheel. 2nd I give to my son
Samuel G Tabb one bed and furniture. 4th I give to my
son Aristed Tabb one bed and furniture. 5th I give
to my daughter Sally L Tabb two beds furniture my
silver spoons, together with all other articles of household
and kitchen furniture of value not specially given by
this will. 6th I give to my son Thomas Tabb one bed
and furniture now in his possession. 7th I give to my

son Henry Tabb one bed of juniperous and brown mare called bet, one
horse called Blaze one wagon & gear, my Stock of Cows & Hogs and
plantation utensils of every description. &c. I desire that my executors
retain for the use of my husband Edward L Tabb one bed of juniperous
and at his death I give it to my daughter Sally L Tabb. &c. in
case of the death of my son Amisted Tabb all that is given him
by this will I desire shall be equally divided among my surviving
children. 10th all the foregoing bequests are made to my children on
the special condition that they at their own expence remove their
Father Edward L Tabb from Virginia to Alabama if he desire it
and that he be permitted to reside among such of them as he may
choose. And that they contribute in equal proportion to his sup-
port during his natural life, to be paid to my executors and by
them applied to his use the sum of two hundred dollars yearly
and in case of the neglect or refusal of either of my children
to comply with the regulations of this my will respecting their
father they forfeit all bequests made to them by this will and
that it be equally divided among such of my children as
will comply with the same. 11th I desire that out of my growing
Crop that all my debts contracted in Alabama be paid, partic-
ularly what shall be found due my son John Tabb for
services in the management of my negroes and for the rent of
his land — And that out of the rest due for my land in
Virginia there be paid to Edward R Chambers an attorney
fee — and the balance be paid to Alexander Drane and any
deficiency to be made to Drane out of any other funds to
satisfy his claim. Lastly I nominate and appoint my Sons
John Tabb and Thomas Tabb executors to this my last
will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal the 26th day of August 1833
