I state off Alabama Dallas County, I Hanny Hassell being in sound mind and perfect memory do this day make my last will and testament as follows, that is to say Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my daughter Charlotte Part my girl Eady abt her because to and her heirs forever Item 2^d I give to my Daughter Mary Ann Tracy her my girl Elancy ther Bequeath to her and her heirs forever Item 3^d I also gave to my Daughter Phency Elizabeth my girl Betty ther Bequeath to her and her heirs forever Item 4^d I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Ann Hassell my boy Joseph and girl Elancy & her increase to her and her heirs forever I also out Head furniture and Head Steed also my Saddle Horse by Wristle Item 5^d I give to my son & Whetmell Jr Hassell my boy Jack to him and his heirs forever Item 6^d I give to my son Hany Hassell my boy Andrew to him and his heirs forever I also gave to my grand son Gabriel Hassell son of the Jr Hassell my boy Ishmael to him and his heirs forever Item 7^d I give to my son Gabriel Hassell my girl Rachell and all increase to him and his heirs forever Item 8^d I gave and bequeath to my son David Hassell my woman Sitter abt her because I also gave him my bed Frame for the maintenance of said David and Elancy also 1 head and furniture to him and his heirs forever Item 9^d I give all my Lands to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my children I also with my Money in hand at this time say four Hundred Dollars to be equally divided between my children Item 10^d It is my will and desire that all my property to remain on the plantation until the crop is made gathering and disposing off I further wish all my parishable property that is not previously mentioned to be sold and the money collected and my just debts paid the remainder to be put at interest and the Interest to go to the maintenance of my sister Anna Cole during her natural life and then after her death to be equally given to

My Children. I now be 13th day of May and
I desire that my Son Josiah Harrel to be my true
and lawfull Executor of this my last will and Testament.
Whereof I do hereunto affix my hand and seal this
the twenty sixth day of May one thousand eight hundred
and forty three. *Jenny Griffen Harrell Seal*

William Short, cabin Rader, J. H. Jones,
The State of Alabama Dallas County, personally
appeared in open Court Jurrell J. H. Jones, one
of the subscribing witnesses to the foregoing Will,
who being sworn depository and saith that he saw
Mrs Jenny Harrell the testatrix sign seal and
execute said will as and for her last will and Testa-
ment that said testifying was of sound mind and disposing
memory at the time of executing the same and that he
the defendant William Short and cabin Rader
signed the same as witness in presence of and at
the request of said Testator and in presence of
each other on the day and year herein named.

John D. Maynard's Will

In the name of God Amen. I, John D. May-
nard of the County of Dallas and State of
Alabama, being greatly infested by bodily affection,
but in possession of a sound and disposing mind
do make and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form as follows. To wit, desire that my
body be disposed in the usual manner by interment
in the family burial ground. I desire that after
my decease my family with all my property
remain upon my premises during the present
year. I appoint as the executors of this my
last will and testament Col. Bernard Job-
son and Mrs Sarah C. Graham also Thomas
J. McLeod and Elias Durant. The two first
named gentlemen to perform the duties of executors
until the arrival from South Carolina of the two
last named gentlemen, at which time Col.
Jobson and Mrs Graham may be released, and
and McLeod and Mrs Durant to become my
