Howell being in sound mind and perfect memory
do this day make my last will and Testament
as following, that is to say Item 1st I gave and
bequeath unto my daughter, Charlotte, my
girl, Eady and her Bureaux to and her heirs forever.
Item 2nd I gave to my daughter, Mary Ann, my
girl, Mary, and her Bureaux to her and her heirs
forever. Item 3rd I also gave to my daughter, Phoebe,
& Beantley my girl, Beantley, and her Bureaux to her and
her heirs forever. Item 4th I gave to my daughter,
Elizabeth, my boy, Peter, and girl, Mary,
and her Bureaux to her and her heirs forever, also one
bed and furniture and bedstead also my saddle
Horse & Bridle. Item 5th I gave to my son
John Howell, my boy, Jack, to him and
his heirs forever. Item 6th I gave to my son, Har-
deman, my boy, Andrew, to him and
his heirs forever. I also gave to my grand son, Gabriel,
my boy, John, my boy, John, to him
and his heirs forever. Item 7th I gave to my son,
Gabriel, my girl, Rachel, and her Bureaux
to him and his heirs forever. Item 8th I gave and be-
queath to my son, Josiah, my woman, Feller, and
her Bureaux. I also gave him my boy, Samson, for the
maintenance of my son and Mary, also a bed and
furniture to him and his heirs forever. Item 9th I give
all my Lands to be sold and the money to be Equally
divided between my children. I also with my
Money in hand at this time say four Hundred dollars
to be Equally divided between my children. Item 10th
It is my will and desire that all my property
to remain on the plantation untill the crop is
made gathered and disposing of. I further wish
all my parishable property that is not previously
mentioned to be sold and the money collected
and my Just debts paid, the remainder to be put
at interest and the Interest to go to the mainte-
nance of my sister, Mary Cole, during her life and
after her death to be equally divided

153 My Children. I am the 15th day of May will and
I desire that my son Josiah Harrell to be my true
and lawfull Executor of this my last will and Testament.
Whereof I do hereunto affix my hand and seal this
the twentyeth day of May one thousand Eight hundred
and thirty nine.

John D. Haynards Will

In the name of God Amen. I, John D. Hay-
nards of the County of Dallas and State of
Alabama, being greatly afflicted by bodily afflictions,
but in possession of a sound and disposing mind
do make and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form as follows. to wit. I desire that my
body be disposed in the usual manner by interment
in the family burial ground. I desire that after
my decease my family with all my property
remain upon my premises during the present
year. I appoint as the executors of this my
last will and testament Col. Bernard J. H-
nson and Mr. Sord C. Graham also Thomas
J. McLeod and Elias Durand. The two first
named gentlemen to perform the duties of executors
untill the arrival from South Carolina of the two
last named gentlemen. at which time Col.
anderson and Mr. Graham may be released, and
and McLeod and Mr. Durand to become my
