lody and mind make this my only and last Will  
and Testament after my funeral expenses and other  
just and lawful debts are paid. I give and bequeath  
to each of my Brothers and Sisters and the lawful  
kins of my Father John Weaver of Williamson County  
State of Maryland back the sum of one dollar &  
also give and bequeath to my Sister Barbara Weaver  
all the rest of my estate both Real and personal

Including the undivided Interest I have in my Father's  
estate both Real and Personal - as part of my legacy  
I further appoint my Uncle Philip S. Weaver of the  
County and State aforesaid my sole Executor  
as witness my hand and seal this Eighteenth day of  
October Eighteen Hundred and Thirty six George S.  
Weaver (Signed) signs and acknowledged before us  
Elijah Wesley W. Randall, & D. Watson
