1822 in the month of August the 20th day John ^{his} Wrought Deed

In the name of God amen I Henry Hill of Dallas county State of Alabama
do make & declare this my last will & testament in manner & form following
1st I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and believing
in a remission of my sins by the merits & mediation of Jesus Christ and
my body I am sent to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my execu-
tors. And my worldly estate I give and devise as follows. First I give
to my beloved wife Rosanna all the property I got by her ^{first} the one half
of the quarter section of land that her father died on - also a negro boy Ben
all my stock of Horses & cattle & Hogs also the land I now live on during the
time she remains my widow I also will that at the death or marriage of my
beloved wife Rosanna that the half Quarter section of land that I now live
on be the property of my oldest sister Polly Hill I also will that my wife
have all my household furniture beds & bedding also the farming utensils
and the present stock of provisions - I also will that my Brother Wiley Hill
get my rifle gun. I also will that my funeral expences and all my last
debts be paid out of money that is due me And lastly, I do appoint
my beloved wife Rosanna Executor of this my last will & testament
In witness thereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of March

The State of Alabama Dallas County. In the name of God Amen I
Thompson Postick of the county of Dallas aforesaid being sick in body but of sound
mind and disposing memory do by these presents make the following disposi-
tion of all my earthly goods as my last will & testament Viz. To my beloved
wife Susannah I give bequeath and devise a negro man Sam his wife
Pheby a man Littleton & a girl Charlotte also the east half of the south
East quarter of section 9 in Township 14 Range 12 containing my present
dwelling. My undivided moiety of the East half of the NW 1/4 of section
14 Township 14 R. 12 purchased jointly by myself & the John Moore my
riding horse the side saddle & a bridle to have possess & enjoy to her own
proper use & benefit during her natural life only. To my son John

I give bequeath and devise two negro boys Edmund & Sampson and the ^{East} East quarter of Section 32. in Township 14 Range 13 in this district. To my son Don Ferdinand I give bequeath & devise two negro boys Tom & Dick and the South West quarter of Section 32. in said Town Range & land district last mentioned. To my son James Alfred I give bequeath and devise a negro girl Finney and a small boy William, and the North East quarter of Section 32 in the same Town Range & land district, all which lands & negroes so devised & bequeathed to my said three sons, to be by them had possessed and enjoyed to their own proper use & benefit, and to their respective heirs in fee simple, and possession thereof to be given them at the times when each of them may arrive at the age of twenty one. My will & desire further is that all my household & kitchen furniture; and all my stock of every description (excepting the horse already described) and all my working utensils remain in the possession use & contrail of my said wife to be managed by her for the use & benefit of all my said children and family except my wagon one horse and the hind gear which I direct to be sold by my executors for the benefit of my estate. At the death of my said wife Susannah my will & desire is that all the property here by given bequeathed and devised into her shall result & belong to my three children or the survivors thereof if any should die previously, and their heirs forever to be equally divided between them. And I also direct that the debt due me be collected as early as may be, that out of the money thence arising all debt duly due from me be paid and my debts be paid for as as the several instalments fall due or earlier if my executors should find it convenient. Of the residue of my money I desire should be laid out in the purchase of a negro woman for the use & benefit of my said children; and I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Susannah and my friends William Moore James Saffold Reubin Saffold Esqrs. Executors of this my last will &c. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal for the purposes herein expressed this 15th day of August 1829.

In the name of God Amen. I Charles M. Lawson of Warren County, State of Mississippi, being sick of body but of sound mind and memory do hereby make this my last will and testament To wit, In case of my death I give and bequeath to Eliza Osburn of Hinds County Mississippi out of my estate the sum of three hundred dollars to be applied to the completion of her education, or otherwise for her use and benefit. To the widow and heirs of the late Noble Osburn deceased of Hinds County Mississippi I give out of my estate the sum of Five hundred dollars To the Heirs of Mary C. Smith wife of Daniel Smith of the said County of Hinds and their heirs forever I give and bequeath my negro boy Sangerfield. To my sister Violet wife of Jeremiah Pollock of Georgia I give and bequeath my negro woman Charlotte forever. All monies due me from my brother Roger Lawson and Archibald
