mixed & Confused, I hereby appoint Maj. John M. Strong
of Selma Executor of this my last Will & Testament and
pray the Supreme Court of Dallas County not to require
him to give Security for his administration of the Same,
I having the utmost Confidence in his Honor & integrity.

2^d after my affairs and interest of every kind whatsoever
are settled and my said Executor has arranged & finally
settled the Same with the Supreme Court of said County
it is my Will & desire that whatever may be in his hands
after the payment of all my just debts may be equally
divided between between my Brothers and Sisters and
their legal Representatives, as by the laws of Alabama
