woman Anna and other considerations. And therefore moving my
Will and pleasure is that she and her child Steamer and all other
children that she may hereafter have be forever free from and
after my death to all intents and purposes. And in order that this
my earnest desire may be effected without delay I hereby direct
my Executors immediately after my death to use every legal effort
to effect their speedy emancipation and until their emancipation
can be effected I direct that they remain with and serve my son
Lionel Robinson. Secondly I direct that the remainder of my
property consisting of the following negroes viz Daniel his wife, Lu-
cinda and her two children Britannia and Green be divided between my
beloved children who may be surviving at the time of my decease
and the heirs of those deceased share and share alike; the heirs of
those deceased receiving such share as their ancestors would have
received had they been living. For the due and faithful execution
of the above directions I hereby make and ordain my esteemed rela-
tives Betsy Robinson and Anderson I make Executors of this my
last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I Susan made the
testator have to this my Will written on one sheet of paper
affixed my hand by my Mark and set my seal this 15th day of
August in the year of our Lord 1833. Susan made dead
signs sealed published and delivered in the presence of T. Smith &
Wm. Brown & J. Dafford.

The State of Alabama In the County of I Lucretia Gamage being of
sound mind but feeble health do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament. In the first place I give and bequeath to my children
Martha Wilson, Bartlett & Gamage and Thomas Gamage each one
third and the furniture thereof. All the other household furniture I
give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Wilson. Be-
sides my Will and desire that all my kitchen furniture, hog, hen,
cow, sheep and all my other personal property of what so ever kind
and all my land shall be sold by my Executor and the proceeds thereof
after paying all my last debts I will and desire to be equally
divided among my children Martha Wilson, Bartlett & Gamage
and Thomas Gamage. I do hereby constitute and appoint
My son Bartlett & Gamage my Executor of this my last Will
and Testament with full power and authority to carry the same
into effect. And I do hereby revoke and make null and void
all other Wills heretofore made by me. In testimony whereof

"State of Alabama Dallas County. Be it known to all whom it may
concern that I Thomas Woods Sen of the State and County aforesaid do make
this my last will and testament, and do make null and void all wills heret-
ofore made by me. I will and bequeath to my wife Lorenna Woods my house
and household furniture and all my moveable and all my stock of
cattle and sheep and horses with my property in the premises which
she now stands in regard to allowing her lifetime and at her death I will
that the negro man Simon shall belong to my son Joseph Woods as to
the other negroes which he got from me and that he pay as length
hereunto, for said Simon. I will to my son William Woods my negro
Parker and Cely. I will to my son Joseph Woods my negroes Reuben and Sarah
I will to my son Lyman Woods George and Maria. I will to my son Thomas
Woods Peter and Anne. I will to my son Andrew Woods Simon and at the
death of myself my negro Dick. I will to my daughter Elizabeth the said
my negro and at the death of my wife my negroes George and Sarah
I leave in entire to her and the heirs of her body I will to my daugh-
ter Cely the negroes Molly and Mary and as to her and the heirs of
her body. I will that my son Joseph do pay to my son Andrew Woods
he gets possession of Simon two hundred dollars and that he give my son
son Andrew Woods one hundred and fifty dollars and that he give them
they arrive at the age of twenty and give to my grand sons William
Woods Thomas Woods and Edward Woods sons of my son Edward Woods
each one fifty dollars to each of them. I will that my son Thomas
Woods shall have my negro boy George for which he is to pay me
one hundred dollars and give me the use of my possession and the
use of the land which I now use and at the death of my wife
I will that my daughter Elizabeth and Cely get all my house-
hold furniture and as their mother may direct and my other
herby horses and stock be sold and equally divided among my
children and my plantations tools and tools of all kinds I will
to my son Thomas Woods and I leave as my executor to carry
this my will into effect to my sons Joseph Woods and Thomas Woods
And I will that my daughter Elizabeth and Cely get at the
death of my wife the two negro children of her, Mandy and
Lebanon and that she pay to Cely the said one hundred and
fifty dollars or one of the children for which I have
now received set my hand and affixed my Seal this 31st day of 1838
