at accounts and Except so much as I shall have her ordination
otherwise also all the cost and provisions in the place
set. Will also ordain that my son George W. Morlock
for example claim forever all my interest in real lands
the state of which I am seized or in any way
belonging to me & I wish to my daughter Henrietta
Stewart five dollars to my Will to my daughter Mary
McMillian five dollars & also will give dollars to
my grand son James Morlock McMillian
And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends
James Craig and John Murphy Executors of this
my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
other former wills by me made heretofore. In witness

seal this the ninth day of October in year One

But if she should die before the youngest child comes of age
then I Will that the whole of my Estate remain together
and be applied to the Rearing of my children and in
case of her death when the youngest child comes of
age for the whole of my estate that there remains to
be sold and equally divide among all my children
and that it goest to my Sons as long as they remain
single the liberty of bearing and collecting any part of
my land that may remain unobstructed to have held
and cultivate the same so long as they live unmarried
or in case they may not their children claim shall
Run out when the youngest child comes of age this
is my last will and testament In witness whereof
