Carson all who witnessed the same at the time of its execution by request of the testator, David Carson in his presence and in the presence of each other and that he was of sound mind at the time, sworn to and subscribed before us on the day and year first above written.

I Lewis Moseley of the state of Alabama and County of Dallas
do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner
and form as follows, viz I give and bequeath to my nephew
Lewis B Moseley (son of Elijah Moseley one mulatto boy named
Peter one negro girl Mary one negro boy named Pit one feather
bed) and furniture eight cows and calves one mare and colt one
third part of my stock of hogs one third part of my working
tools I will that two thousand Dollars due me in Georgia, go to the
payment of my land. I give and bequeath to my dear beloved
wife Elizabeth Moseley seven negroes viz David, Rose, Bryant, John
Martha, William and Aggy with all the balance of my personal
property not mentioned I also will her one half my land, includ-
ing my plantation with all the things named to her during her
natural life I will to Lewis B Moseley my nephew (son of Elijah
Moseley, the other half of my land, I also will that all the
property left to Elizabeth Moseley my wife with all its increa-
se be left to my nephew Lewis B Moseley, son of Elijah Moseley
at her death I also will to Lewis B Moseley (son of Elijah
Moseley) two town lots in the town of Cahawba No 252 & 254
I nominate constitute and appoint Lewis B Moseley (son of Elijah
Moseley) and Elizabeth Moseley my wife Executor & executrix
of this my last will and testament. hereby revoking all other
and former wills by me at any time heretofore made. I
intrep whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and seal this
30th day of August in the year of our Lord 1821
