and that I goant to my Sons as long as they remain
single the liberty of bearing and Cultivating any part of
my land that may remain unaccord to have held
and cultivate the same so long as they live unmarried
or in case they may not their children claim shall
Run out when the youngest child comes of age this
is my last will and testament In witness whereof

executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking

1838.
