My Last Will

State of Alabama Dallas County. In the name of God Amen
 I John Hardy in the State and County aforesaid being mindful of
 my mortality, Do this eighth day of April A.D. one thousand eight
 hundred and sixty five make and publish this my last Will and
 Testament in manner following - Ist resign my soul into the hands
 of Almighty God and my body to be buried according to the directions of my
 family and friends - And my worldly estate I give and devise as follows
 Ist Give liquidate debts unto my beloved wife Leahy Hardy the whole
 & General part of my Estate which the laws of the State of Alabama would
 allow her at my decease, provided I had made no distribution testament
 in the former Will now it being her choice to receive her portion
 in the aforesaid manner - 2nd I wish all the remainder residue
 of my worldly estate both General and Part to be equally divided
 between & among my Children viz. Michael C. Hardy, Washington
 Hardy, Jefferson Hardy, Robert J. Hardy, Norvella C. Olson,
 Susan Hardy, John Hardy, Emily Hardy, Mary J. Hardy,
 Elizabeth Hardy, Benjamin Hardy, Catharine Hardy & Thompson
 Hardy. And I do Give & bequeath unto each of them an equal share
 of my real & personal estate, But as I have given Michael, Washing
 ton, Jefferson & Robert Hardy each a Negro a piece I wish these
 Negroes when brought into the division or otherwise deducted
 out of their shares of my Estate according to the above provision
 3rd Give & bequeath unto Benjamin & Thompson Hardy my
 two sons who have not finished their Education \$150.
 for the purpose of their better Education. That is to say
 Benjamin Hardy fifty dollars & Thompson Hardy one hundred
 dollars to be paid out of the Estate of 1865 & 1866.

My ventures for the payment of their tuition expenses - It is my wish that my daughter Hannah Gibson may have an equal division of my estate with the rest of the above named children except the value of a negro woman named Suky which I have decided to bestow to the heirs of his body - I wish the land to remain together undivided except that which falls to my wife Lucy Hardy & until Hannah my youngest child becomes of age And my Personal Estate I wish divided & appraised in such a manner as the case will admit. & the appraisers I request, to be John Washington Jefferson & Robert Hardy my sons I wish may be returned at what they may think at the time of appraisement & lastly I do hereby give title and appraise my son Jefferson Hardy & my friends John Lee and Littleton Edwards trustees of this my last will and testament to carry it into effect according to my last desires above written.
