### John Chambers Will

I the State of Alabama Dallas County, in the name of God Almighty  
I John Chambers of the County and State aforesaid being mad  
of my Mortality do this day make, and publish this my  
last Will and Testament in manner and form following.  
To Wit. First of Will I beseech to God, my bed to the grave  
and that my Grace be with me in death or life  
suitable Medicines and Drugs over with a gentle Stone  
under the direction of my beloved Brother Joseph Chambers,  
and that the expense of said grace &c shall be first paid  
out of my Estate Next I wish all my just debts to be paid  
as soon as possible after my decease (In case there may be)  
Next I wish and beseeche that my brother Joseph shall have  
the sole and undivided right to my Negro Man Jack, free from hire  
or charge until January 1<sup>st</sup> 1868, in which Month he shall  
be sold to the highest bidder on a Credt. of twelve  
months (12), among my brothers and my sisters, Mary Jane  
Chambers and Anna Murphy as the only bidders; and a  
I do further will and beseeche that at the time the  
purchase Money of said Negro shall fall due it shall  
be collected and so shall a note also for the collection  
and not until that time made by my brother Joseph  
Chambers on the 21<sup>st</sup> July A.D 1865 to me for One  
Hundred and Sixty Nine Dollars, and Fifty two hundredths  
of a Dollar (\$ 169.52) due January 1<sup>st</sup> 1866 and that  
said Note shall then be paid (in the year A.D 1867)  
Without any interest whatever, I now will and bequeath  
that when the aforesaid sum of Money shall be collected

Mansfield the sum of money for the Negro Man Valets and the like on  
my Brother Joseph for \$1139.52 that my brother David W. Chambers shall  
have and receive the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) and that  
the remainder of my estate or money & real & chattel & such other bequeath  
devised among my brothers Bryant Chambers, James Chambers, David W.  
Chambers and my Sister Mary Jane Chambers, and that the legacy of  
the apportioned and hundred Dollars to my brother David W. Chambers,  
shall give no wife disparage or prejudice his claim to an equal share of  
the remainder of my effects or estate. It is further my will to direct  
that the portion which is here allotted to my Sister Mary Jane Chambers  
shee upon her demise without giving receipt to my Master before named  
brother and then if shee doth not will & request that a note for Sixty five  
Dollars which I hold on Andrew Adams shall be collected as soon  
as due & the proceeds applied to the payment of my first debts of Mansfield  
of West Hill and bequeath that my brother Joseph Chambers  
shall have and keep to his own proper use and benefit my said  
bedding and furniture, which I have not hitherto disposed of  
West and East Hill and appoint my well beloved brother Joseph  
Chambers my sole true and lawful Executor to execute this my  
last Will and Testament, the tenth day of June, as I have given evidence  
in his honesty and integrity, have under my hand  
and seal this the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September 1865 A.D. 1865  
W. C. Chambers, T. G. G. in the presence of Wm. H. Alexander  
W. B. Jones, Elijah Bill, the Notary Public of Oklahoma, Dallas County  
Especially appeared in open Court Wm. H. Jones one of the  
Subscribers, witness to the foregoing Will who being first duly sworn  
doth say that he saw the Testator Wm. C. Chambers sign  
and seal and execute said Will after his last Will & Testament had  
said Testator was of sound mind & disposing memory of the time  
of executing the same that he this deponent Wm. H. Alexander  
et al. signed the same as witnesses in the presence of  
and at the request of said Testator was in the presence of  
each other on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, Mansfield, Okla., Wm. H. Jones  
Sworn up & subscribed by the parties in open Court this 8<sup>th</sup> September
