full power & authority to do and perform all requisitions and
provisions herein after pointed out. I. My will and desire is
that all my Just debts be paid and the remainder of my estate
managed and conducted as herein after pointed out. I. My will
and desire is that all the property that I may be possessed of
at my death both real & personal remain in the hands wife Mary
Miles to raise my children on, at her death or on her marriage it is
my desire that my executor should manage my estate in that
very manner in which he may think most to the interest of my
children as fully & freely as if I myself were present to act
for them. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

Court of pleas and quarter sessions opened and held for the County
of Cooke at the courthouse in Keokuk in said County on the fourth
Monday in August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty four being the twenty third day of said month
by before the worshipful Saml. Sandings James Allen and
Richard B. Sewett Esqrs. Justices of the peace and commissioned to
hold said court a paper purporting to be the last will & testament
of Edwin and Consey died in the words & figures following was
produced in open court by Charles J. Porter & William C. Hogan two of
the executors therein named to wit. I Edward Consey of Dallas County
State of Alabama do make this my last will and Testament
I give to Charles J. Porter and Sarah Porter my mother my whole

Estate during their natural lifetimes after their deaths I wish it divided
- as of as following. One thousand dollars of the estate to Sarah Ann
Elizabeth Hogan daughters of W^c Hogan (and my minor I wish to be
and fifty dollars each to Edward C. Carnayam and Charles J. Porter
Carnayam sons of Preston B. Carnayam to be exclusively applied to their
Education. the balance I give equally to brother Charles William Jones
Conway. I appoint Charles J. Porter William C. Hogan and Major
William Conway Executors to this my last will and Testament. In
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of
August 1821. Edward Conway (D) Signed sealed in the presence of
Samuel Lee Samuel Erwine. Which said last will and Testament so
produced was duly proven in court by the oath of Samuel Lee and
Samuel Erwine the two subscribing witnesses thereto as the law directs
and recorded. And thereupon the said William C. Hogan and Charles
J. Porter two of the Executors in said Will named with the leave of
the court in open court took upon themselves the execution thereof
were qualified as Executors and entered into bond and security for their
faithful performance as such as the said directs all of which was

the last will and Testament of Edward Conway dec^d now of record
