full power & authority to do and perform all requisitions and
provisions herein after pointed out 3rd My will and desire is
that all my just debts be paid and the remainder of my estate
managed and conducted as herein after pointed out 4th My will
and desire is that all the property that I may be possessed of
at my death both real & personal remain in the hands wife Abby
hiles to raise my children on, at her death or intermarriage it is
my desire that my executor should manage my estate in that
way manner in which he may think most to the interest of my
children as fully & freely as if I myself were present to act

State of Tennessee Cooke County. Be it remembered that at a
Court of Pleas and quarter Sessions opened and held for the county
of Cooke at the courthouse in Newport in said County on the fourth
Monday in August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty four being the twenty third day of said month
by before the worshipful Sam'l Hastings James Allen and
Richard B. Seivert Esqrs Justices of the peace and commissioned to
hold said court a paper purporting to be the last will & testament
of Edward Conway late in the words of figures following was
produced in open court by Charles J. Porter & William C. Hogan two of
the executors therein named to wit. of Edward Conway of Dallas Co.
State of Alabama do make this my last will and Testament
I give to Charles J. Porter and Sarah Porter my mother my whole

Estate during their natural lifetimes after their deaths I wish it divided as follows. One thousand dollars of the Estate to Sarah and Elizabeth Hogan daughters of W. C. Hogan (and my wives) two hundred and fifty dollars each to Edward & Barnayen and Charles & Porter Barnayen sons of Preston & Barnayen to be exclusively applied to their Education. The balance I give equally to brother Charles William Jones Conway. I appoint Charles & Porter William Hogan and/or William Conway Executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of August 1821. Edward Conway D signed sealed in the presence of Isabella Lee & Samuel Brown. Which said last will and testament so produced was duly proven in court by the oaths of Isabella Lee and Samuel Brown the two subscribing witnesses thereto at the law directs and recorded. And thereupon the said William C Hogan and Charles & Porter two of the executors in said will named with the leave of the court in open court took upon themselves the execution thereof were qualified as executors and entered into bond and security for their faithful performance as such as the law directs all of which was ordered to be certified. State of Tennessee William Garrett Clerk of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions in & for the County of Coke in said state do hereby certify the foregoing to be a true copy of the last will and testament of Edward Conway dec'd now of record in my office, as also of the record of the probate thereof and of the qualification of William C Hogan and Charles & Porter executors of said will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand private seal having no seal of office at office in Newport the 8th day of November A.D. 1824. Isabella William Garrett Clerk of John Inman Presiding Justice of the court of Pleas & quarter sessions for coke county in the state of Tennessee do hereby certify the foregoing certificate and attestation of William Garrett clerk of said court to be in due form of law & that there is no seal of office to said court given under my hand & seal this day of November 1824.

It is my will & desire that a female slave named Bettie now about three or four years old be manumitted and that my executors do apply to the Legislature for
