Waugh & Rosina Waugh my youngest daughter and I do hereby appoint

on be the property of my oldest sister Polly Hill I also will that my wife
have all my house hold furniture beds & bedding also the farming utensil
and the present stock of provisions. I also will that my Brother Wiley Hill
get my rifle gun. I also will that my funeral expences and all my just
debts be paid out of money that is due me. And lastly I do appoint
my beloved wife Rosanna Executor of this my last will & testament
In witness thereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of March
