

Lewis Sidwell's Will

The State of Alabama Dallas County, I Lewis Sidwell being  
feeble of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory make  
Constitution and declare this my last will and testament. I desire  
that my body shall be decently interred at the cost of my estate,  
Secondly, That all my just debts be paid by my Executor as law  
as practicable. Thirdly, I will and bequeath to my trusty friend  
Lorenzo Griffin of the State and County of fore said, my negro Woman Fanny  
with her future increase if any, but upon this Trust the just and  
total fulfilment of which is confidia to his known honor and in-  
tegrity; That at the master of the said Fanny, he will controul  
her and protect her according to his own sense of Justice humanity  
and propriety, and that he will permit her to use and enjoy without mo-  
lestation the fruits and emoluments of her own Labor, so long as she  
may live; and if it be her wish that he will allow her to go to some  
State where domestic slavery does not exist, and take with her any  
children she may have; if she should here after have any. But if she  
prefers remaining where she is that she be permitted to do so I trust  
that my friend Mr Griffin will take all rightful and proper steps  
to ensure the fulfilment of my wishes in relation to the said Fanny.  
I am fully apprised that in bequeathing her to him at I do we will  
be under no legal compulsion to respect my wishes respecting her.  
yet I have full confidence that my wishes thus expressed, will not  
be disregarded. If Fanny should survive Mr Griffin he is requested  
earnestly so to provide, that my wishes respecting her and her issue  
should there be any in future, shall be strictly carried into effect;  
that she and any Child or Children she may here after bear be  
permitted to enjoy the fruits of their own labour during life, and be  
permitted if desired, and it be practicable, to remove to some  
State where slavery does not exist. Fourthly, I will and bequeath  
to the said Lorenzo Griffin during the life of the said Fanny or so long  
as she may remain in this State my house and lot in the town of  
Selma, with the appurtenances; and that the said Fanny be permitted  
to occupy it so long as she may wish; and and if it be leased  
or rented, that the said Fanny be permitted to have enjoy the proceeds  
after defraying the expences of necessary repairing and taxes on the  
death of the said Fanny or her removal from this state, then the  
said house and lot to descend and belong to rightful heirs then  
living. Fifthly, the remainder of my Estate of what ever kind  
(after the payment of my debts,) I will and bequeath to my brothers  
David & H. and Charles Leamell to be equally divided between  
them with out a day if practicable. Lastly, I appoint my  
said friend Lorenzo Griffin Executor of this my last will  
requesting at the last favour I will probably ever ask of him  
that he will accept the appointment which it is hoped and  
believed he will not find onerous. Given under my hand.

in Selma in the State and County aforesaid, the twenty-fifth day of October  
A.D. Eighteen hundred and forty six

William H Lee & James Hall two of the Subscribers witnessed to the foregoing  
will who being duly sworn deposeth and saith that they saw Lewis Trammell  
the testator sign and seal and duly execute the same for his last will & testa-  
ment that said Testator was of sound mind & disposing memory at the  
time of executing the same & that they these deponents and Wm M Lapley  
signed the same as a witness in the presence of and at the request of said  
testator and in the presence of each other on the day and year then in said  
mention'd Wm H Lee James Hall, Subscribers

of the County of Dallas and State of Alabama, being yet in  
health and in the expectation of death but sound in mind  
and in full possession of my reason do hereby and herein make  
again and declare on this nineteenth day of June A.D. 1864  
this my last will and testament, revoking all others  
Item 1. My body I desire to be decently interred in the  
public burial ground at I close upon a square of ground  
which I desire my Executor to be hereinafter appointed, to  
purchase and have timely in close, my soul I command to go  
trusting for its reunion with the body at the last day and  
its everlasting salvation to the merits of Jesus Christ Our  
Lord to whom be glory and honor forever and ever Amen  
Item 2. I desire all the expenses necessary for my funeral to be paid  
and paid and I do hereby authorize the payment of One  
Thousand dollars to Mrs. Dony Ann Hall to be by her approp-  
riated to the purchase of suitable monuments to be placed on  
the remains of my wife, wife and her infant son and the ent-  
ombing of the same with a handsome railing of iron should the  
said sum of One Thousand dollars be not sufficient I will be  
gave to the said Mrs. Dony Ann Hall power to draw upon  
my Executors for the sum which may be wanting after the  
One Thousand dollars have been expensed and hereby direct my  
Executor to pay said balance etc the inscription on the monument  
I leave to the direction and task of the said Mrs. Hall
