manner, and thirdly I desire that all of my just debts  
and funeral expenses be paid, and fourthly I give  
all my property both real & personal that is to say  
of to my wife Polly Haskeen and my three daughters,  
(viz) Susan Haskeen, Sarah Haskeen, and Eliza  
Haskeen, and it is my wish that the property both real  
& personal be kept together by my executors as the common  
joint property of my wife Polly Haskeen & my three daughters  
Susan, Sarah & Eliza, in equal shares in common  
and at the death of my wife land it should be divided  
by my daughters above named, and if dependent by my  
executors then for them to divide the property equally  
between my three daughters, Susan, Sarah & Eliza, for  
their use & benefit. In testimony whereof I have  
signed this my hand and affixed my seal this

of Setme & executors of this my last Will & Testament and  
pray the Orphans Court of Dallas County, not to require  
there to be one Society for the administration of the same,  
& having the utmost confidence in his sound & integrity.

2. after my affairs, and interest of very kind Whatever  
are settled and my said Executor has arranged finally  
settled the same with the Orphans Court of said County  
it is my will & desire that whatever may be in his hands,  
after the payment of all my just debts, may be equally  
divided between Astorina my brother and Sister, and  
their legal representatives, as by the laws of Alabama  
it should be distributed. In witness whereof I
