and also my bed stand. Thirdly to my Grand daughter
Mary Ann Curtis my negro slave Louisa to have and
to hold to my Grand daughter her heirs and assigns
forever. Fourthly to my Grand daughter Catharine Ann
Hiles a Negro Girl between the ages of nine and twelve
years, the Negro to be purchased by my son in law William
Curtis out of my personal effects and I enjoin it on
my son in law to make the purchase fairly and transfer
it immediately to my Grand daughter Catharine Ann
Hiles or so soon may be practicable, also one bed and
the furniture thereto belonging to hold to my said Grand
daughter her heirs and assigns forever. The one half of
the property that may be coming to me from the estate
of my father, I give to my daughter Ann Lee Curtis to
have and to hold to my said daughter her heirs and assigns
forever. Fifthly, the one half of any property that may
be coming to me from the estate of my father I give to my
daughter Elizabeth Hiles to have and hold the same
and her heirs and assigns forever. And lastly I do
hereby constitute and appoint my son in law William
Curtis executor of this my last will and Testament
hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments

bequeath to James Collins sixteen dollars to buy him
a saddle and bridle. and I do hereby nominate
and appoint my beloved Mother Martha Collins and
my trusty friends Arthur Collins & Wm B. Walker of
the County aforesaid Executrix and Executors of this
