of myself to wit a part of lot numbered thirty three of Lots no.
fourty four five together with all other property held by me in the
Village of Cahaba either on my own separate account or jointly
with my aforesaid Brother David. I do give and bequeath unto
him the said David Crockeron Subject to the debts which I now do
or may owe at the time of my death. And I do further give and
bequeath unto my Brother David Crockeron the whole of my part
of an undivided moiety of the Quarter Section known as Gallows V.
in the East & South West Quarter of that one Township fifteen in Range
nine. And I do further declare that my will and intention is that the
whole property both real & personal which I own is to vest in and
become the property of my Brother David Crockeron And I do hereby
nominate and appoint my said Brother David Crockeron sole Executor
of this my last will & Testament Signed Sealed & published this 27th day
of August in the year of our Lord 1823. Nicholas Crockeron

In the name of God I Samuel Parker of the State of South Carolina and Edgefield District being weak in body though of sound mind & memory & understanding praise be God for the same do make my last will & testament in manner & form following viz, First my will & desire is that my present crop of cotton shall be sold my self my negro fellows Peter and the money arising from such sale to be applied to the payment of all my First debts and the overplus of any to remain in the hands of any one and to set for the support and maintenance of my family. Secondly I will & desire that my wife Elizabeth Parker shall have the sole use and benefit of the plantation tract of land whereon I now live containing ninety six acres at her own will & pleasure until my youngest son Richard Parker shall become eighteen years of age at the end of which term of time the said tract of ninety six acres shall descend all to my son James Parker and his full share of my estate then I give unto my two grand children Valma & Julia Gardner son & daughter of my daughter Rachel Gardner de'd the sum of five shillings to be paid by my executors when they shall come to be ^{the} age of twenty one years in full for their mothers part for I have given her there before. Item I desire that the balance of my property besides as above mentioned shall be appraised and inventoried and remain in the hands of my wife & set for the support and maintenance of herself and children and the balance subject to be equally regularly divided between my wife & my six children viz Judah & Elizabeth Matilda Ezekiel John & Richard Item my will & desire is that my three daughters Judah Elizabeth & Matilda shall have their proportion which shares at the time of their marriage and should they not marry before the time that my son Richard shall come to be eighteen years of age they shall then receive their share as well as all the rest of the legacies aforesaid Item I desire that my wife may take care of and raise my two grand children aforesaid as long as they shall deem necessary together with my own children out of my estate. Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Parker and John Cedarham Lucas Executors of this my last will & testament making void all others and do declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of Sept. in the year of our Lord 1868 Samuel Parker signed sealed & delivered in presence of William Hill Robert Tenney Nathan Parker.
