

State of Alabama Dallas County October the 2nd 1829 In the
name of God Amen I Patrick Hoase of Dallas county State of
Alabama do make & declare this my last will and testament in man-
ner following First I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty
God hoping and believing in a remission of my sins by the merits
and mediation of Jesus Christ. and my body I commit to the
earth to be buried at the direction of my friends. and my worldly
Estate I give and devise as follows First I give and devise to
my beloved wife Rachel as much of the household furniture and
kitchen furniture as she may think proper to keep. I also give to her
during her life my negro boy Stephen and my black girl Lucy. I
also will and bequeath to my beloved wife Rachel as much of all
kinds of stock and farming utensils as she may think proper to keep
for her own use. I then will and bequeath that as much property
be sold as will be sufficient to discharge all lawful debts against
the Estate I then will that my Black Woman Rose and my Black
boy Andrew be sold and if there be a sufficiency of money left that
may arise out of the sale of property & crop after paying my debts
that my daughters Polly & Lewisy be furnished with a good saddle
apiece and then that my daughter Fanny & Legatha & Sally & Polly
& Lewisy be furnished with a horse apiece worth about sixty dollars
apiece which property I will and bequeath to my daughters above
named & their heirs forever. I will that the land I now hold be sold
and that my wife have the whole control of the money arising from
the sale of said land to purchase a place for her to spend the rest of her
days on and then I will that my wife Rachel dispose of her
household furniture as she may think best. I then will that the rest
of the property that may remain after her death be sold and equally
divided amongst all my children and that the part that falls to my
daughters Polly & Lewisy be theirs & their heirs forever. I also will
that as soon as John Cooper can pay up the money I am bound for
for him the property I have in pledge of his is his. And I do hereby
appoint my wife Rachel and my son James Executors of
this my last will & Testament. In witness I set my hand and
signed sealed and published and declared by the said Testator as if for
his last will & Testament in presence of us who at his request in his presence
have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto

and memory knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die and
after death the Judgment. I ordain this my last will and Testament
First I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine & little Son
all the household furniture of this place that I am in possession of during life

And also the Quarter Section of Land that I now am in possession of and
my negro boy, ^{name} George. While she remains my widow. If she should marry
I will and bequeath the land to be rented out and negro boy to be hired out until
my daughter Jane is of age for her use and then to hold the same
in fee simple. Witness my truly, truly friend James M. Harrison to be executor
of this my last will. Whereunto I have set my hand and seal this 17th of

I Thomas Rigby of the State of Alabama & County of Dallas do make
and ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form following, to wit:
I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Williford one dollar & give to my
son Enock Rigby one dollar. I give and bequeath to my son Veste Rigby one
fourth part of the land whereon I now live. I give to my son Ephraim Rigby
one fourth part of the land whereon I now live and also one feather bed & furniture
I give to my son Thomas Rigby one fourth part of the land whereon I now live
and also one feather bed & furniture and the like sum of one fourth part with a
feather bed & furniture to my son Elijah Rigby and for each of them to pay one fourth
part of the balance due for said land I would that all the debts due to me should
be collected and my just debts paid and the balance of that put to the use of
paying for the said land I will that Thomas & Elijah Rigby should have
two years schooling out of my loose property, and the remainder of my loose pr-
operty, stock household & furniture to my wife Jane Rigby for her to have
and to hold in peaceable possession during her natural life and at her death
I will that the balance which remains to be equally divided betwixt my
four sons Veste Rigby Ephraim Rigby Thomas Rigby & Elijah Rigby
I constitute my wife Jane Rigby and my son Ephraim Rigby Executors
and Executors of this my last will and Testament thereby revoking all
other and former wills by me at any time heretofore made. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 17th August 1821.
