Hearseant Lee's Will

In the name of God amen. I Hearseant Lee of the
County of Dallas and State of Oklahoma laboring under bodily
affliction but being perfectly sound and Capable in mind
knowing the certainty of Death and yet the uncertainty of
the time when that solemn event may take place
think it necessary for me to arrange my temporal concerns
at this time and as such do make and Ordain this my
last will and testament in manner and form following
viz: First I leave unto my Daughter Elizabeth Cox
Dinner of her natural life the following property to wit
Estate I now possit, Ditta, Harriett, Louise -
Grace, Vielle, Harry, Sam, Martin, Anna, Bob
and Lydia and also this Bed and furniture and two
Kds stands and four stands of Curtains One large
Chest One I have One Brace Candy Stock One
zig, Trunk and one knife Box and if my daughter
Elizabeth Cox should have a heir or heirs of
her body to live I give the above
named property together with the income to her child
or children as the case may be and if my daughter
should have no heir or heirs born of her body
to the above property then in that
case I give the above named property
also unto my Grand Children
daughter Nancy Stance

and at any death I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth ^{the 22d}
One Thousand Dollars in Cash.

Second I bind unto my daughter Nancy Nancy during
her natural life the following property, to wit) Eleven Negroes
to wit, Minnie, Nannie, Nabby, ^{all} Nancy, Frank, Sally & Co.
Hatt, Larkins Sam and Luke from old and three
Bedsteads and All Bedding furniture not otherwise
disposed of and one hundred Pounds and at the death of my
daughter Nancy Nancy I give the above named
property together with the increase unto my Grand
children the Children of Nancy Nancy to be
Equally divided among them All.

Third I give unto my Daughter Nancy Nancy
after Discharging all my debts All the money that
is now on hand or may hereafter be and all the money
that is now due or owing unto me or may hereafter
be due or owing unto or in any wise coming to me
and all my lands that I now have or may hereafter be
possessed of and also the Crops that is or may be on
hand at my death and also the Stock of Horses,
Hogs & Cattle that I may be possessed of in my
full right at my death together with all other property
not otherwise disposed of by this will that is in
any wise belonging to me or may be at my death.

I constitute and appoint my Friend James
Nance my Executor for the purpose of Carrying
this my last will and testament into effect, hereby
overuling all other wills heretofore by me made or
instruments of writing purporting to be such in
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 28 day of September 1839 Pleasant Lee Esq.

all the rest of my estate both Real and personal

Including the undivided Interest I have in my Father's
estate both Real and Personal - as part of my legacy
I further appoint my Uncle Philip S. Weaver of the
County and State aforesaid my sole Executor
as witness my hand and seal this Eighteenth day of
October Eighteen Hundred and Thirty six George S.
Weaver (Signed) signs and acknowledged before us
