

In the name of God Amen I Reuben White of the County of Anson and State of North Carolina, being of perfect mind and memory but being in a low state of health and calling in to mind the shortness and uncertainty of life do by these presents constitute this my last will and testament in the manner and form following after resigning my body to the grave and my soul to the disposal of Almighty God & dispose of my worldly effects as follows (viz) I leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth White three negroes known by the following names Cate & Bob & Hannah and ten head of cattle the choice of my stock and thirty head of dogs and one horse named Dick and one mare named Doll two beds and furniture and such property of my household furniture and working tools as my executors may think she stands in need of during her natural life and at her death the following property to be sold and the money arising to be equally divided amongst my children that are now living. Item 2. I leave to my Daughter Elizabeth Jackson my two negroes Lucy and her child Moses during her natural life and no longer and after her death them and their increase to be equally divided between the heirs of her body. Item 3. I place in trust of my Executors hereafter named the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to be by them loaned out at interest for the benefit of my grand daughter Frederick Perry Crawford until she shall become of lawful age and to be by them paid over to her at such time or in case of her death before she may arrive at lawful age then the said sum thus disposed of to be equally divided amongst my children and their heirs that are now living. Item 4. I place in the hands of my Executors to be hereafter named the sum of fifteen hundred dollars to be by them invested in lands that are or hereafter may be sold in the Alabama Territory for the entire benefit of my three sons David White Joseph Allen White and John Phelps White the titles whereof to be taken in the names of said David White Joseph Allen White and John P. White jointly and to be divided amongst them equally when they or either of them may become of lawful age and in case either of the said children David Joseph or John P. White should die before they arrive at lawful age then the lands thus procured to be equally divided amongst the survivors or survivors. Item 5. I give all my estate both real and personal that hath not been disposed of to my following children Nam Saml. David White Satsay White Elizabeth L. White Joseph A. White and John P. White to be equally divided amongst them provided always George Seneclare the husband of said Saml. Seneclare shall render a just and true account of what they have heretofore received which is to be deducted from her share. I do hereby constitute my three brothers named White Josiah White and Zachariah White my Executors to my last will and testament. In the name of God Amen. I Robert Royston of the County of
Clark and State of Georgia being now of sound mind, and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die and knowing not when
the hour of my Desolation may take place, do by these presents make
this my last Will and Testament, That is to say. First I submit my
Soul unto the hands of my God who gave it and my body to the dust
from whence it came hoping for a happy reception amongst the just
when the faculties of my mortal frame will be forgiven and wised away
by the hand of my almerciful Creator Secondly. I wish all my just
debts to be paid. Thirdly. I do give and bequeath all my Estate both
real and personal unto my only Son Robertus Royston to him and his
heirs forever. provided never theless that if my Son Robertus Royston
should die before he marries or arrives at the age of twenty one years
it is my wish that my property may be equally divided between my
relations and the relations of my deceased wife. I wish to be understood
that agreeable to request of my deceased wife and a contract made with
her by a bill given to my son Robertus Royston for eleven negroes
(to wit.) Calami, Shada, Wesse, Charlotte, Demah, Lowdon, Lone and Malinda
(Children of Calami) Joshua Belin, Children of Shada Wesse the son of
Charlotte, and the said little having never been recorded. I do hereby
bequeath the aforesaid eleven negroes to the said Robertus Royston
to be entirely at his disposal at any time after my decease.

I do hereby appoint my worthy friends Peter Early and Oliver Porter
Esquires my Executors to this my last will and testament and I
wish them to take the Charge of my Son Robertus Royston, and to
give him a classical Education, and I wish them to be well paid for
their Services out of my Estate, in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my Seal this twentieth day of August
1816 (Signed) Robert Royston (Seal) Test John Greenwood, Joseph
Cotton, Thomas Legan.

for all men once to die, do make and confer this to be my last
will and testament in the manner and words following (viz) first of
all I give my soul into the hands of my Creator who gave it me
and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of
my friends. After all my debts is paid then I give and bequeath
to my beloved wife Polly Davis the whole of my Estate both real
and personal during her widowhood or natural life. I desire that my
Estate may be equally divided amongst my six children, namely
Clemens Davis, Nancy Davis, Thomas L. Davis, William Davis, Polly
Davis & Sally Davis. I constitute and appoint my wife Polly Davis
and John Rose Executor and Executrix to this my last will and
testament. Written with my own hand and sealed with my seal

State of Alabama, being sick and weak but in perfect mind and
memory, do ordain this my last will and testament. First I leave to my
beloved wife Eleanor the use of the quarter section of land that I live on
and two negroes Jacob and Rachel, and all the farming utensils and
stock and household furniture, except the waggon which I allow to be
sold, as long as she remains my widow for the purpose of raising and
rearing the children. I will and bequeath my negro boy York to my
son John as soon as he becomes of age in part of his legacy. I ordain
these my trusty friends David Russel and James A. Morrison to be my
executors to this my last will and testament. given under my hand
and seal this 25th of September in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty (Signed) James Russel
