Item 5th I Will as soon as my youngest Child comes of
age that all my property be Equally divided and all the Incom-
-e thereof of the same amongst the following persons My Wife
Subj My Son Andrew Jackson, Francis Marion my
Daughter Parilee Nancy and the Child with which she
is now Pregnant Item 6th I Will that the Oldest Son
named Robert Porter which Was born in Wedlock between
me and my wife some short time after our marriage
I Will that the aforesaid Robert Porter Receive Good Every-
day Cloths and Two Years Schooling a Good Horse and
Saddle and one Hundred Dollars and one Good Suit of
fine Cloths Item 7th I Will that the plantation known
as my present residence better known as the North
East-quarter of Section Eight in Township Sixteen

of Range Tractor be kept up by my Wife and my Executors
 untill the time of the youngest child Comed of age and when
 the child Comed of age I Will an Equal division between the
 before named Children (except) Robert Porter who it to have the
 Portion allotted for him in Item 6th Item 8th I Will that the
 following named Negroes and all their Increase remain on the
 plantation and be divided as aforesaid to Say Penny Abby Rachael
 Winy Sam Martha Sarah John Charity Kinfus Nora & Aildery
 together With all my horses Cattle hoggs Corn fodder House hold
 and Kitchen furniture and all the debts due me at the time
 of my Death Item 9th I Will that James Burns Elbert O Sullivan
 and my beloved Wife be Executors to this my last will and testament
 and I further Will that my Executors shall have such pay as they
 may deem Just for their services as Witness my hand and seal
