I Robert Gault of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount
do hereby make & declare unto my last will & Testament in manner &
form following that as 1st I give all my estate both real and personal
to my 4th youngest children to be equally divided amongst them to wit
Mary Ann Gault Benjamin R Gault Caroline Gault Elizabeth Gault
and Elbert Gault and it is my desire that my wife Elizabeth Gault
during her natural life or during her widowhood shall possess & oc-
cupy and enjoy my said Estate for the support of herself & family
&c. It is my desire and I do hereby authorize my said wife Elizabeth
to sell & convey all my lands in East Tennessee as a Trust for my
children named 4th children or in case I should purchase lands in the Alabama
Territory the proceeds of the sales to be applied to the payment thereof for
as that same may be necessary &c. Whereas a doubt is entertained that my
son Samuel Gault intends to intermarry in the family of Jesse Wallace
(son in law) of the Town of Marysville against the intention and consent
of his parents. Therefore I leave in the hands of my wife Elizabeth a
Negro boy slave named Elijah and I do make provision that she shall
pay him five hundred dollars both which legacies are to be given to him
so soon as my said wife may be satisfied he has abandoned all preten-
sions to such intermarriage and not before of which she is to be the Judge
&c. I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Elizabeth Gault
Sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of August 1815.
Signed sealed published & declared to be the last will & Testament of the above named Robert Gault in our presence who at
his request and in his presence have hereunto subscribed our names as
witnesses thereto John Lowry Charles Bonchoe John Wrough. The State
of Alabama Dallas County Jesse Beene being duly sworn deposes
that he is well acquainted John Lowry Charles Bonchoe & John Wrough
who have subscribed themselves as witnesses to the will written upon
the other half of this sheet that he is also acquainted with the handwriting
of each of them by having seen them write that their names are
written in their own proper hand and that they are respectable
men and further that did at the date of said will reside in
Blount County Tennessee Jesse Beene sworn to before me

In the name of God Amen. I David Pace of the County of Blount
and State of Alabama being sick weak in body but of sound & disposing
mind & memory do hereby publish and declare this and more other to be
my last will & Testament in manner following that as to say I commit
my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
herein after mentioned and after all my just debts are paid I
desire and bequeath as follows. It is my desire that my
Executors hereinafter named pay all my just debts out of the

Proceeds of my crop on hand & stock on hand which they are hereby
authorised to dispose of as they may think to the best advantage and
should the proceeds of said effects not be sufficient to discharge my
just debts it is my will that they hire out my negro fellow Joe
until they are enabled to pay them from his hire. I further authorize
and require them to hire him at private sale and to one or other of
them my said Executors paying special regard to his good treatment.
Secondly, after all my just debts are paid it is my will & pleasure
that my said Executors herein after named petition the Legislature
of the State of Alabama to free my said negro fellow Joe which if
granted it is my will & request that they my said Executors do grant
unto my said negro fellow Joe his freedom for life in manner & form
according to law. But should the Legislature not grant the petition
alluded to it is then my will and pleasure that he the said negro
Joe remain in the hands of my Executors to be disposed of by
hiring at a bond directed and the money arising from his hire after
deducting necessary expenses to be given to said negro fellow Joe
as my Executors may see he requires. It is further my will
and pleasure that should there be any money left from the sale
of my crop & stock after paying my just debts that it should
be appropriated by Executors to the benefit of my negro fellow
Joe. And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friends
William Heste William Holmdrick & Walter O Bickley of Dallas County
and State of Alabama Executors of this my last will, testament
hereby revoking and annulling all other former wills and
testaments by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 31st day of January 1824 David Pace (Seal)
Signed sealed in the presence of the undersigned who have subscribed
the same as witnesses thereto at the request for the presence of the
Testator Alexander Cuthery John T Bickley James Sinclair
State of Alabama Dallas County. On this 31st day of January
1824 personally came before me the undersigned Judge of the county
court of said county Alexander Cuthery and John T Bickley who
being duly sworn depose & say that the said David Pace
sign seal Publish & declare the above instrument to be his last will
and testament. That he was in sound mind and memory and that
they subscribed their names thereto as witnesses in the presence of
