

Sally L. Fobell Will

The State of Arkansas Dallas County. In the Name of God  
I Am <sup>the</sup> Sally L. Fobell of the County and State aforesaid,  
being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make Constitute  
and appoint this My last Will and Testament hereby revoking  
all other and previous Wills which I may at any time have made.  
In the first place I give and bequeath to my Brother Thomas  
Fobell My tract of Land lying in the state of Mississippi adjoining  
his present residence and in case I should sell the same  
before my death it is my will and desire that my Executor  
thereafter to be named shall pay to him out of my estate the  
amount in Cash for which said Land may have been sold  
and I further more give & bequeath to my Brother Thomas  
My negro boy George all of which said bequests shall be  
to him and his heirs forever. Secondly I give and bequeath  
to my Brother Henry Fobell my Negro Thomas Clark and  
his children and the increase of the females thereof that  
may be in my possession at the time of my death also any  
Money that he may owe me at the time of my Death and  
six hundred dollars in Cash to be paid by my Executor  
to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly I give to my nephew  
Edward Fobell son of John Fobell my Silver Table and two Spoons  
and Tong to him and his heirs forever, and in the event of his  
not surviving me then said Spoons and Tong shall be left  
between them to my nephews John Fobell son of John Fobell  
Fourthly I give and bequeath to the Cumberland Presby-  
terian Minister that may be Pastor of the Union Church  
Dallas County if any at the time of my death a full  
suit of black Broad Clothe Clothes to be paid by my  
Executor out of my estate. Fifthly I give to my  
Brother John Fobell all the remainder of my estate  
not herein before disposed of to his Children personal  
together with all of my Money that I may have on hand at  
the time of my death (after paying off all of my just debts)  
also all debts that may be due from him by me from  
any other source. I give and bequeath to my said Brother  
John Fobell to him and his heirs forever - and I do  
hereby appoint and constitute my said Brother John  
Fobell my residuary legatee and sole Executor of this my  
last Will and Testament, and it is further more my will  
and desire that there shall be no apprenticeship of my estate  
and that the Court shall require no further security of my  
Executor than his own bond. In testimony whereof I have

### James C. Campbell Will.

I James C. Campbell of Dallas County State of Oklahoma being indisposed in bodily health but of sound and disposing mind and memory calling to mind the frailty and uncertainty of human life and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs. And thinking how the Estates which I have hitherto had pleased God to bless me shall be disposed of after my decease while I have strength and capacity to do the same and publish this my last Will and Testament.  
Having recited and making Ruth and Arid all other past Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made—  
First I command my immediate family to him who goes to my body to the earth to be buried with little expense and cost estimation by my executors hereinafter named and as to my worldly estate and all the property both personal or mixed of which it may die saying and stipulating to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease I desire to give and dispose thereof to the manner following—  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> My Will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall by my executors hereinafter named be paid out of my Estate as soon after my decease as will by them be found convenient. Item I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Campbell all my house hotel and kitchen furniture together with the Stock of Horses Mules Wagons Cattle Hogs and Geese which we have etc.
