this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and annulling
all other and former Wills and Testaments by me at any
time made. First, after the payment of all my just
debts and Funeral Expenses I Give and bequeath unto
the Children of my Son William T Thompson in lawful
Wedlock begotten said William T Thompson living at
this time said three good feather beds and Furniture
for the same and Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars
in lawful Money to be equally divided between said Children
to William T Son of Wm T Thompson Die I Give specially
one set Silver table Spoons and in case said Children
should die before coming to lawful age or should die
without Children in lawful Wedlock they then
the said Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars and
the said three good feather Beds and Furniture for
the same to go to my Son Andrew Jackson Thompson

qua his heirs. Second I Give and bequeath to my son
Andrew Jackson Thompson my Glassed Carriage and
Motel of Horses together with the Sallance of my Horses Mules
and Stock of all kinds also my household and Fitted
Furniture, German and Plantation tools and all personal
property not otherwise disposed of and all money on hand notes
Rights and Credits which I may have at my death not otherwise
disposed of. Third I kindly Nominate, Constitute and appoint
my son Andrew Jackson Thompson Executor of this my last
