perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following (that is to say) after allowing just and lawful
debts are satisfied, I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Chandler
One Negro girl named Esther, One Cow & Calf and one Bed & furniture
Also I give and bequeath unto my son James Proutley One
Hundred Acres of Land situate in Hancock County Georgia, One Negro
girl named Mary and her child, One Horse & One Bed & furniture
— Also I bequeath unto my daughter Olive Stallard an equal part
of the remainder of my property not otherwise appropriated

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Youngblood
One Negro girl named Monrovia, One Horse, One Bed & furniture & two
Guns & Cartridges

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Pullak
Three Hundred & fifty Dollars beside the property which I have already
given

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Leadrina Hengerson
One Negro girl named Eliza, & One Bed & furniture

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ruth Chandler
One Bed & furniture

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Gordon One Negro
boy named Wm, One Bed & furniture & one Horse of Sash.

Also I give and bequeath unto my son James Proutley One Hundred
& Thirty Eight Acres of Land situate in Hancock County State of
Georgia, One Negro girl named Fannie, One Horse, One Cow & Calf
& One Bed & furniture

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Frances Gordon
all that part of my tract of Land lying in Range N^o. 11. Township
N^o. 16. Section N^o. 5. west of Alabama River commencing at the
N. West Corner of said Section, thence South twelve & one half miles to the
Big Branch, thence up the same until the line to wit the N. W. &
N. E. Corners of said Section, thence following the line around said
part of said N. W. Quarter to the beginning, containing Eighty Acres more
or less, One Negro Boy named Washington, One Cow & Calf and one
Bed & furniture

Also I give and bequeath unto my son John Proutley Three
Hundred and Eighty three Acres of Land more or less lying in Range N^o. 11.
Township N^o. 16. Section N^o. 5. west of Alabama River, One Negro Boy
named Baptist, One Horse, One Bed & furniture with the cattle I
have already given him

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca King

One Negro Boy named Prince, One Negro girl named Jane One Cow & calf
 & One Bird furniture

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Edith Grant One Negro in
named Mattias, two Cows & Cattle & One Bed & furniture & fifty Dollars
in Cash
