all rights claims and demands for money or other things of value
and all goods and chattels and money which I may own or possess
or which may rightfully pertain or belong to me at the time of my death
I hereby nominate and appoint the above named John Marshall
Executor of this my last Will and Testament - In testimony whereof

 debts and Personal Expenses I Give and bequeath unto
 the Children of My Son William V Thompson in lawful
 Wedlock begotten said William V Thompson being at
 this time dead three good feather beds and Furniture
 for the same and Two Thousand Six hundred Dollars
 in lawful Money to be equally divided between said Children
 his William V Son of Wm V Thompson Die I Give specially
 one set Silver table Spoons and in case said Children
 should die before coming to lawful age or should die
 without Children in lawful Wedlock, hereafter then
 the said Two Thousand Six hundred Dollars and
 the said three good feather Beds and Furniture for
 the same to go to my Son Andrew Jackson Thompson
